Program Description

The program involves the Business Applications 1 & 2 courses, which covers essential computer concepts, computer programs Microsoft PowerPoint, Word, Excel, and Publisher. Some of the computer concepts covered include file management, input/output devices, storage devices, computer software, networks, and the Internet. Also included is the creation of worksheets and embedded charts, formulas, functions and formatting, creating and using a database, querying a database, maintaining a database, and sharing data among applications.

The Business Management program builds upon learned software skills and offers students a look at the importance of business management in the business world of today. Topics covered include the evolution of management, careers in management, and the management environment. Foundational skills such as problem solving, decision making, and written and verbal communications are also developed. Through the team concept, students will experience all aspects of business ownership through simulating the operation of a mock business venture, including developing an actual product for the company.
