I believe Duck was there in the sand somewhere, can't say for sure!



## CHADWICK

If you remember in last month's issue, I received an email regarding the blocks the Forest Service is using for erosion control on the trails at Chadwick. I said that I would love to get a formal reply from the Forest Service. Not only did I get a formal reply from them, but I also received a personal letter from Rick Moon on this subject.

I also made a trip to Chadwick just to take pictures of the improvements being made, including the bridges, the campground expansion and, of course, the blocks.

Even though I had stayed at Chadwick for five days helping with the enduro, I didn't run down and look at the campground expansion. It's

big. Maybe I'm wrong, but it seemed to triple the size of Cobb Ridge Campground. Electricity is going in. The old rest rooms are gone. The new ones are open.

I saw a couple of bridges completed. However, the trails have not been relocated to use them yet. In fact, if you head down 119, it closes at 119A, due to the construction.

The official reply is on the next page and Rick's personal reply follows that.

This is a personal note concerning the blocks and Chadwick in general. Chadwick is a very special place to me since I practically grew up riding there with my parents since I was old enough to hold my head up. Chadwick is also special to me because I am ????fortunate???? enough to get paid (partially) to take care of it. This brings me to the purpose of this letter. It is extremely disheartening for me to work so hard trying to keep Chadwick open and make improvements that I feel will make riding there more enjoyable only to receive a bunch of negative comments. For instance, in the past year or so we have drilled a new well, built a new bathroom, worked on numerous trails (including replacing the bridge at Rattlesnake), and closed several hill climbs and basically tried to make the area a nicer place for everyone. Then all I hear is that the riders need to start a letter writing campaign because a couple of trails are slick. If

you would like to keep Chadwick open, I would start a letter writing campaign stating how much you enjoy the area and appreciate our efforts to keep it open. Constructive criticism is one thing and complaints are another. If anyone has an idea on how to reduce erosion without using the blocks, we would love to hear it. When the District Ranger and the Supervisor's office read nothing but negative comments about an area, why would they want to keep it open???

Since the Fee Demo program started in 1997, the Forest Service has received about 5 positive comments on the work we are doing. In that same time we have received probably 20 or more negative comments, such as "the blocks are too slick," "we don't need water," and my favorite, "the new bathroom stinks" (anyone remember the old one??). My God, talk about



If the area is left alone, the chances are very slim they would ever get that chance.

I would ride by a series of hill climbs that I had closed a few months before, only to find the brush and trees drug out of the way. I like job security, but it seems more like I'm trying to "push a chain."





The land would be limited during hunting season! Once we can get all the details together on this proposal, we will discus it further in a later meeting and vote on what the club would like to do.

Mel knows a guy that has 80 acres close to Marshfield that would like to put on a few events each year. It would require work to set up the trails. Bart suggested that maybe he would allow the club to cook out and camp on his land to help set the trails up. Mel will get more information from him and let us know.

Bart has read in magazines how at different races they name some of them wild and crazy names. He thought that would be kind of cool to do for some of the races that we put on, so that when the racers talk about the races they can keep up with ones by their names. (What does everyone else think about this?)

At the last Hillbilly Grand Prix race there were 114 riders, with more dirt bikes than four wheelers this year compared to last. It was a great turnout with perfect weather! The next Hilly Billy Grand Prix race will be December 17 at Powell Ranch-Marshfield, MO.


