

ILLINOIS VETERANS' HOME AT CHICAGO

The Illinois Veterans Home at Chicago will be located at 4250 N. Oak Park Avenue in Chicago, which is adjacent to Chicago Reed Hospital. The building is scheduled to be completed in December 2019; with admissions to start in April 2020. The facility will provide long-term, skilled nursing care.

The building consists of five floors. The first floor will have resident common areas, administration, and the facility's support departments. The second floor will be a skilled nursing Special Needs Unit that is secured to help keep residents who wander, safe. The Special Needs Unit will have its own roof-top garden outdoor space.

Floors 3-5 will be open access, long-term skilled care nursing units. Each resident room is single occupancy with a private bathroom which includes a wheelchair accessible shower. Each community living unit will have its own serving kitchen area, separate dining area, living room, and den.

The Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs (IDVA) is currently taking names for veterans who wish to apply for admission to the Home or those names of current residents who wish to transfer to the Chicago Home once it opens. Starting in October 2019, we will contact interested parties to begin the admission application process. Please do not send applications at this time.

- If you are a current resident of one of the Illinois Veterans Homes and wish to put your name forward to transfer to the Chicago Home, please contact the Adjutant's Office at your Veterans Home and request they forward your name to the Senior Home Administrator.
- If you are interested in applying for admission to our Chicago Veterans Home and would like to be notified when the application procedure is opened for the Chicago Home, please contact the IDVA Central Office at (217) 782-6641 or via email at idva.media@illinois.gov to be placed on our list to receive an application. Please provide the following information:
 - Name of Veteran
 - Name of Point of Contact for the Veteran, if applicable
 - Mailing address for Veteran or Point of Contact
 - Phone Number for Veteran or Point of Contact
