Hi All:

A couple of members have asked that I do this list again. I did one a long time ago, but things change so fast now it's hard to keep up. I think most of us remember all our kids slept on their tummies with bumper pads around their cribs - not anymore! I was going to take our grandchildren skiing in a backpack as I did when the kids were as little as 6 months - not anymore!

Anyway, most everything that follows is self-explanatory. The Ace bandages are for sprains, for holding a compression dressing in place and/or holding a nice pack on.

The syringe is not for injecting vodka into Oranges for a morning pre-fishing libation, they are for washing out a wound before sanitizing and dressing. Use saline solution for this if possible - rubbing alcohol may require several of the oranges mentioned in the first sentence.

Keeping a belt or short section of rope handy can be the best emergency tourniquet - but using any tourniquet is a last resort. The aspirin is critical - not much better if immediately swallowed if a heart attack is suspected.

Medicine Cabinet:

Syrup of ipecac Benedryl (epi kit if prescribed) Aspirin Aleve Tylenol NyQuil - daytime NyQuil - nighttime **Combination pack of bandages** Q-tips Pack 3-4 inch compression bandages Box of regular band aids Two or more ace bandages Roll of cotton tape Large and small bore syringes Rubbing alcohol Suntan lotion Antiseptic cream/Neosporin Tweezers and nail clippers Saline solution Dramamine Liquid stitch Plastic ice pack or bag of frozen peas or corn. Belt or two foot section of rope

For Pets: Pumpkin pie mix Flour or pancake mix White rice



Note: our dogs will try to eat anything atleast once. Also swimming in salt water can get their stomachs really messed up. The best thing to do if they get bad tummies is don't feed them for 12-24 hours, then start them on a bland diet - hence the white rice. You can add a tablespoon of pumpkin pie mix for fiber - it works great. Then slowly introduce small amounts of their irregular food as they get settled. Dry toast also helps.

The pancake mix and/flour are great for application on animal cuts to stop bleeding. We used it after cutting Boswells nails and one of them started to bleed. The pancake mix stopped it very quickly!

We try to keep a supply onboard of and prescription medications just in case we forget to being them each trip.

We are hopeful of having an EMT display CPR and emergency wound dressings before May's meeting - will advise shortly. However, I encourage everyone to go online before the full start of boating season and watch a YouTube demonstration of current CPR techniques. No more blowing into a persons mouth. It's just rapid and firm compressions.

Hope this is useful - We want to know as much as we can in the event you get sick and we would hope you would be as prepared as possible in case we do!!
