Everyday life promises much, but in the end Lent's Ash Wednesday reminds us we are dust and to dust we shall return. We are the creatures and HE is the Creator.



If you have been cleaning out your house during these long winter months, you can also help out by donating all your items to the church or renting table space for \$20 to sell your own things. As you all know, I was elected to be a member of the Board of Elders at the November 2014 voters meeting. Once elected to the board, the members of the board choose me to be their chairman. In reviewing our Saint Paul's constitution there are seven basic responsibilities assigned to the Elders. I have meet with Pastor and our congregation President, Paul Mehrkam as well as having discussions with some of the board members and collectively, we have concluded that three of the seven responsibilities are of the highest priority.

Assist the Pastor in the spiritual care of the congregation...

Encourage faithful attendance at divine service and at the Lords supper...

Provide for an atmosphere of reverence and devotion and see that all services are conducted in decent and proper order.

In addition to these specific responsibilities, it has been the practice at Saint Paul's that the elders assist the Pastor in preparation of the altar for the services, assisting the Pastor in distribution of the Lords supper and as ushers to receive the offering.


In the coming weeks and months, the elders will be looking into ways in which we can address the three aforementioned responsibilities to better meet the needs of the congregation. One area of focus will deal with alter preparation and serving of communion. Some of us elders are new to this (I more than any) and need to be trained by others who have it down pat. We will be doing this through on the job training and by developing written Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). Sorry about the military terminology but I have worked for the U. S. Navy for 50 years and old habits are hard to break. This effort addresses responsibility number three above.

With respect to responsibilities 1 and 2, we have been kicking around ideas but we need to have further discussions before proceeding.

If any members have thoughts about your expectations from the board please feel free to share them with any member of the board, Pastor Tim or our congregation president Paul Mehrkam.




