### **RAGBRAI News -**

## **Amana Route and Street Closures**

An estimated 30,000 bike riders will be passing through the Amana Colonies Friday, July 28 as RAGBRAI sweeps across eastern lowa.

The official route takes them down F15 Blvd and onto Highway 220 via West Amana, High Amana, Middle Amana and then through downtown Amana and on to Homestead as the riders head east to Iowa City via less busy paved roads.

Main Street in the village of Amana will be closed to auto traffic from the Visitor Center to Price Creek (about 100 feet) to allow folks to park their bikes directly on the street. Additional bike parking will be set up at various locations in the village Amana.

Bikes will be routed from the Amana 4-way stop east down Main Street (220th Trail) to the corner by the Market barn/ Visitor Center. To exit town they will be directed south past the Market barn and onto H Street in Boy's town.

Residents of Boy's town be advised that this will be a very day in your neighborhood as bike riders drive through town.

Then came my wedding day. I had no intention of wearing lace and frills, but Esther was determined I have a pretty dress so just by chance someone had come to do an article about "Zuber's Restaurant" for a magazine.

In the magazine was their dress which Esther would recreate into a work of art. She stitched mushrooms, wheat, Queen Anne's lace flower all over the bottom of the shirt via crewel work.

The entire dress cost between \$30-\$40 dollars. Charlemagne's suit coat mush more, but then wore that to church for years.

Needless to say "sewing bug" slowly crept back and through the years I would make countless Halloween costumes, a few dresses, at least three Santa Claus suits, etc.

Everything looked like and amateur who had been drinking heavily had sewn them, but I was at least sewing.

I would even try patchwork quilting. That was interesting until the time I had to sew that quilt blotches together.

Let me say that the Amana quilting ladies have nothing to fear from me.

So now I have two machines gathering dust in storage.

Truthfully there is no place to set up the machines and/or tables to cut fabric on.

I have this sneaking feeling that as my coffin is lowered into the ground the sewing machines will be tossed in with me and all my dreams will come to an end.
