6 The Buzz with Rabbi B



Grateful

I was cleaning up from dinner last night when I felt that familiar buzzing coming from my iPhone. I picked it up, expecting to read a text, but was instead reminded by the calendar app that today is the 14th day of the Omer. What is the Omer, you ask?

The Omer is a special period of time that we are in right now, which starts on the second day of Passover and goes all the way to the holiday of Shavuot on May $31^{st} - 49$ days. During this period of time, we are instructed to count each day and acknowledge our gratitude for the blessings of our day to day lives. Counting each day forces us to focus on mindful gratitude for 49 days in a row – a spiritual practice. If we can pause each day, open our eyes to the blessings

around us, and express gratitude for them, we will be able to more fully appreciate our lives.

I find myself acknowledging a lot of blessings these days, as I reflect back on this year in our Religious School, and on the nine years that I have been fortunate enough to run our school. As you likely are aware, when I transition to the role of Senior Rabbi this summer, Rabbi Lenette Herzog will take over as Assistant Rabbi, and will also be in charge of running our Religious School. Rabbi Lenette is truly wonderful and will significantly enhance our program and our congregation. She will bring creativity, dynamism, professionalism, a deep knowledge of Jewish content and Jewish schools, and a lot of fun and campiness. I'm so excited to see where she and our Religious School Committee take our school next.

During my tenure running our Religious School, I have been so fortunate to be surrounded by some of the best teachers, madrichim, and lay-leaders in existence. This past year we had a particularly healthy year in our school. School enrollment held steady at 255 students engaged in our weekly program. We have grown our school in the past nine years by more than a third, about 100 students, and have worked hard to maintain the sense of community and joy that drew people to TBS in the first place. This year, we have 26 dedicated, caring, knowledgeable, and creative teachers, who show up each Sunday morning to give our students a Jewish home-base. Over 50 madrichim and madrichim in training (7th grade - High School aides) enhanced our program this year, from helping teachers in their classrooms, to doing one-on-one tutoring, to helping with art projects, to taking pictures and videos, to even wearing our ridiculous animal costumes. The madrichim bring so much energy to every Sunday morning.

We are so fortunate to have the best teaching staff at Temple Beth Shalom Religious School. We have lots of veteran teachers who have been with us for a number of years. Their expertise and knowledge of Jewish education is so valuable. We also have a number of new teachers, who have brought enthusiasm and renewed creativity to our students each week. Thank you so much to Zach Abramowitz, Jordan Ankerman, Jodi Benningfield, Marvin Blank, Susie Blank, Bonnie Cram, Barry Daroe, Angelo Dunlap, Galit Golan, Marcie Golden, Brett Handmaker, Emily Hartman, Dani Hopping, Robin Leasure, Joe Malinger, Danielle Mormol, Meredith Paul, Gail Rose, Ben Rosen, Marc Rossio, Katie Schneir, Adrianna Schnider, Lauren Sferrella, Oren Shai, as well as Rabbi Apothaker, Rabbi Leigh Ann Kopans, Bonnie Abramowitz, and Kathy McGee, all of whom dedicate their Sunday mornings to educating our kids and imbuing them with a love of everything Jewish.

Throughout the years we have worked diligently with a fabulous Religious School Committee to make enhancements to our school. Since 2008 we have modified our program by adding Chugim (activities), by changing and modifying our Hebrew program (which is again being tweaked for next year), by adding specialty classes like Advanced Hebrew and Advanced Judaics for students interested in fast-paced learning, by reworking the entire Judaics Curriculum, and putting together our own outline of the most important goals for each grade, by adding Holocaust Education and trips to some of our older grades, by adding retreats to our program, by separating Hebrew grades into smaller classes to get better access to skill development, by adding a Torah chanting class to sixth grade, by enhancing our...



100 Days — A Message from Kibbutz Kef Camp Director, Ben Rosen

I am an impatient person by nature. As a child, when I decided I wanted something, I would strike deals with my parents to make sure I got it as soon as possible. A new video game would be released and I'd approach my dad with, "I know my birthday isn't for another three months, but how about we consider this an early birthday present? I'll even throw in a car wash for good measure! "Typically, I got my way; I would get the game when it came out, my Dad would get his car washed and everyone was happy.

Unfortunately, one can't bargain with Father Time. This concept was never more apparent and torturous than at the start of May. School would soon be out and, of course, my birthday would be a little more than a month away. Somehow, these waits paled in comparison to the one day that I dreamed of for eleven months out of the year – the first day of summer camp at Goldman Union Camp Institute in Zionsville, Indiana. I was (and still am) a Jewish summer camp fanatic, desperate to return to my home away from home (believe me, the Zionist/Zionsville metaphor was not lost on me). To gain some semblance of control, many of us resort to countdowns. We count down to the new year, to our well-deserved vacation, to the start of summer camp. While we can't strike a deal with G-d to make the world orbit the sun at a faster pace, we can come to an agreement with our calendars. We say, "I know this event is a ways off, but how about I put a big red 'X' on days that have passed and you get me a day closer to what I really want?" I, for one, really appreciate this agreement that I have with Father Time. It makes the wait a little more tangible and thus a bit more bearable.

music program with superb music staff, by implementing a training program for madrichim in seventh grade, by adding an Open Hebrew one-on-one learning space, by implementing a fantastic Mitzvah Day, and more. Our Religious School committee has consistently done a fantastic job of helping implement major improvements throughout our school in the past nine years, and God willing, for many more years to come.

This past March and April, our Religious School Committee surveyed a sample of the entire school, including teachers, students, and parents, to find out what people like about TBS Religious School and what need improvement. This was no small feat, and the committee collected valuable data, so that when Rabbi Lenette begins working, she is aware of the big picture of our school.

This past year marked our sixth year of Religious School at the JCC New Albany / Columbus Jewish Day School. It is almost hard to remember a time when Religious School was held at the Temple. While it may not be ideal to meet offsite, the space at the JCC New Albany is unbeatable, and much better than we could ever have at the Temple. 
