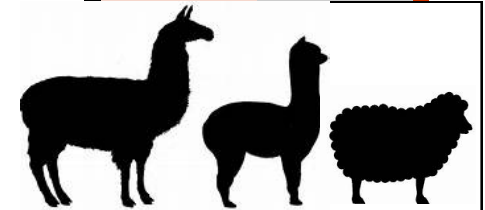

Grand & Glorious Gradients with Peggy Doney

Peggy's method for dyeing 36 colors in a gradient family will have you overjoyed with color. You'll leave with yarn samples, sample cards and recipes. Please bring an apron, pen or pencil, goggles (optional) and wear old clothes and comfortable shoes (not sandals),

Beginning Weaving with Karen Kinyon

Karen will teach you the basics of weaving while you weave your own alpaca scarf. Looms will be ready for use but Karen will also cover the threading the loom.

Morning Workshops (\$50):

Silk Painting with Kay McCoy

With a background in a painting and a passion for fiber arts, Kay will help you paint your own silk scarf. Several designs will be available. Prepare to unleash your own creativity.

Choosing Yarn 101 with Tashia Butterfield

Not sure about using natural fiber yarns? Or substituting yarn in a pattern, Tashia will teach you how to understand labels, gauge and best uses for yarns. You'll try several different yarns in gauge swatches.

Afternoon Workshops (\$50):

Knooking 101 with Kay McCoy

Knooking is knitting with a crochet hook. Kay will teach you the technique as you make a washcloth. A different tool for your fiber arts arsenal, plan to explore the possibilities.

Create a Cowl with Tashia Butterfield

Brioche isn't just a type of bread; it is also a knitting stitch that adds texture. Advanced Beginners on will enjoy knitting an cozy, close to the neck, camelid cowl.
