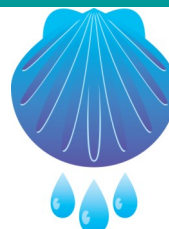

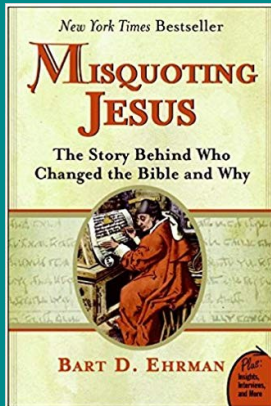
The Cub Scout Pack that meets regularly at St. Stephen will be selling Discount Cards on Sunday, June 2 before and after services.

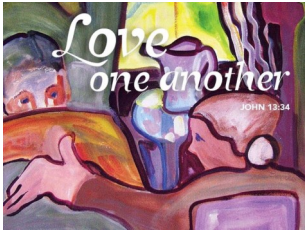

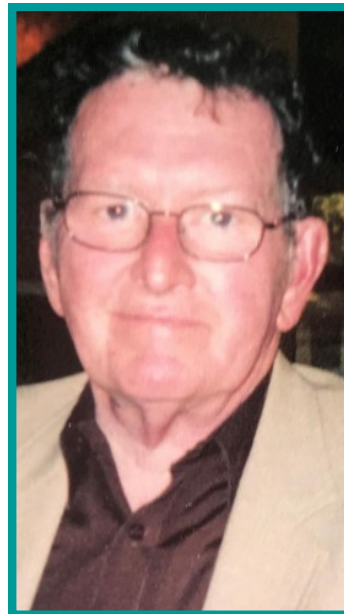
Wayne Koch

Review

Theroux is a middle-aged white guy who writes novels but is better known for his travelogues. This travelogue tracks his trip through China and Tibet in the late 80's. Theroux is somewhat misanthropic and he says, quite accurately, I think, that travel books are less about travel than they are an autobiography of a person who is travelling. I did, however, get to live vicariously, learn some things, and enjoyed this book. Who knew people spit so much in China? Why does he keep asking everyone he comes across about the Cultural Revolution instead of asking more about themselves? I am convinced that travelling by train would be great, but I could never do it for a year like this; and I can't help but identify with Theroux to such a degree that it's almost as if I have.

This is the third time I have read The Babylonian Captivity of the Church. It is about the sacraments. Reading it is always a worthwhile study of Luther's thoughts on these and on their abuse. This time I was struck by just how crafty Luther was and by how incisive. After each of the catechisms, I think this is a great place to begin one's reading experience of Luther.

San Miguel is hard to classify. I enjoy Boyle and have read most of his books. His plots often involve separate vantage points being intertwined into one in order to play off of one another. They are an exercise in comparing and contrasting. San Miguel unfolds, one section at a time, through three different women and, though this is not Boyle's only time writing as women (The Women being another), I suppose it works. I think the themes of sacrifice and isolation work. The writing is vintage Boyle. But Boyle has written elsewhere about the Channel Islands off of the coast of California – remember the rat sermon? (It was inspired by his other, better book – When the Killing's Done.) So, this somehow feels like I've read it before but is still engaging. Though the setting is somewhat desolate, I enjoyed it more and more as it progressed and the chance to compare and contrast, and grow, came more into effect.

You've already gotten a detailed review of A Year of Biblical Womanhood. All I can ask is: have you read it yet?

This is my second time to read American Gods, and it, admittedly, was better the first time through. As do all of Gaiman's novels, it deals with mythology, but this one ends up shedding a lot of light of on what it means to emigrate, to be changed by a new land, and to become a culture of newness and forgetfulness. If you haven't read this or any Gaiman, you like novels that move along, but that still make a statement about the condition of belief and traditions in America, this is worth looking into.

After returning from NYC earlier this year, I wanted to re-watch Seinfeld. The 90's are the vintage vantage point of the moment, so that felt spot on. And I wanted to see how much the show is a New York-centric thing (and to me the answer is 'very'). In the end, I don't see how anybody can't enjoy this. For me, it's better with age.

Columbus isn't about the guy who sailed the ocean blue OR the capital of Ohio. It's about Columbus, Indiana. The plot is sparse. The pace is slow. And – in a culture of blockbuster movies – I don't know how prepared we are for movies like this. Columbus, Indiana is, apparently, a Mecca of modern architecture; and the movie is really more about the buildings than anything else. It's a great movie if you like architecture, subtle acting and plotting, or being inspired to go on weekend trips to not-too-far-away-but-still-never-knew-it-existed places. As the movie depicts, they even offer tours of the many famous buildings, several of which are churches.

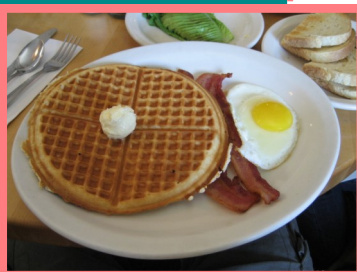

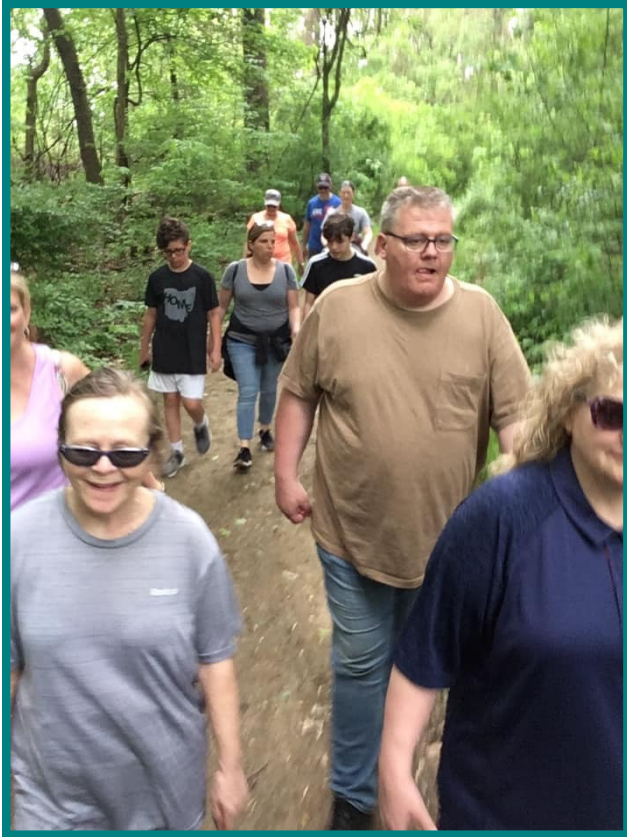
