

## Old Business

1. Use of shopping carts and flat beds: Because residents are "borrowing" (and not returning) them, Michael must now buy new ones, but this time they will be Bell Carts, used in hotels, so that they cannot fit in your apartment or in the trunk of a car. **If you have a shopping cart belonging to HKRC in your apartment, please return it.**
2. Name plaques in buses: They are ready for installation. Learn the name of your bus driver and be sure to thank him for his service.
3. Photos and name labels above the mailboxes. This is a long-standing request.
4. Bulletin boards: The mirrors by the elevators are not to be used for posting announcements. The bulletin board for that purpose is located on the wall adjacent to the elevator. Take your announcement etc. to Jasmine to be OK'd by Michael, and she will post it for you.
5. Daily calendars by elevators: The west wing calendars on the three floors by the elevator are not being changed each day. Chair Bobbie asked for volunteers from the residents, but none was forthcoming, so it is suggested we go back to having the night ambassador person change them as he does his nightly rounds.
6. Dining Room broken chairs by windows: Michael said they had all been removed but (ed. Note: they were all still there at lunch today. If that table in the middle of the DR was removed, and the tables realigned as before, there would be more room, and safer, for servers and those with walkers to navigate.)
7. Name change for the BDR (Back Dining Room): Everyone agreed, including Michael, that the new name for the area where activities take place and people relax on the sofas, will be THE MAKAI LOUNGE.
8. Stocking of Snack Bar: Residents have been seen taking more than one item from the Snack Bar, and in some cases a handful. As a result, we other residents have had to wait for a few days for the Snack Bar to be replenished. **If you see someone taking more than one item, report them to the dining room supervisor, or the main office...and you can also politely talk to them and ask that they consider thinking of others who would like to have a snack.**
9. "Buttons" on bottom of new straight-back chairs: Residents are finding them difficult to move. They do not slide and are heavy to lift, and residents have been requesting plastic buttons be attached.
10. Constant problem of "reserved" tables: (1) all guests are not signing in at the desk or buying meal tickets; and (2) residents are coming to the DR as early as 11:00, placing a seat pad or an apple/orange on a chair, and leaving...only to come back at lunchtime and claiming that table as there's. And not just that chair, but the entire table. A suggestion (in addition to constant reminders in these Minutes and at our Welcoming get-togethers): On the table menu, in large letters, a reminder that no table is reserved; no seat is reserved, and no one is to be told they cannot sit there.
