## Friday September 22nd- BARN HUNT DAY- for all levels of BH dogs Seminar Giver: Eva Raczka and Karen Cummings

#### Morning Session 9AM-Noon: Key Concepts in Barn Hunt

We will be discussing and practicing hard hides, discrimination challenges, distance handling and tunnels (elevated and other). This grab-bag of seminar topics will cover lots of different key concept focuses for handlers and dog. We will discus Crazy 8s class differences as well.

#### Afternoon Session 1PM-5PM: Handler Skills and Strategy

Humans have a huge effect on their dogs and Barn Hunt is no different! Learn how pressure, talking, rewards systems and YOUR mental state effect your dog. The LIFTT (Location, Intensity, Frequency, Type, Timing) rewards system will be discussed in length and put into practice!

#### Saturday September 23rd- NOSEWORK DAY- for experienced and competing NW dogs

**Seminar Giver: Julie Symons** 

#### Morning Session 9AM-Noon: Key Concepts in Nosework

A revisit to some key concepts in Nosework including...hide placement, the art of running known hides, creating confidence and building motivation during the search, and value of aborting a search that is going badly. We will also discuss some NACSW rule changes, the new AKC program (including buried hides!), and similarities and differences between all the venues.

#### Afternoon Session 1PM-5PM: Handler Skills and Strategy

The human half is 50% of the team! This seminar will work on honing your handling to be the best partner for your scenting dog! Topics included: Consistent handler mechanics, reading your dog's change of behavior before, at and after finding source, and how to cover a room for single and multiple hides. Planning search strategy will be discussed at length.

# Sunday September 24th- TRACKING DAY-for all levels of tracking dogs Seminar Givers: Kate and Deb Eldredge

#### Morning Session 9AM-Noon: Key Concepts in Tracking

Attention tracklayers! This key concepts seminar will discuss tracklaying methodology including transitions from different textures to ensure the track you lay is the track your dog can learn from!

#### Afternoon Session 1PM-5PM: Handling Tracking

This seminar exposes you to line handling, how to handle a corner, how to handle a stopped dog or searching dog. We will also discuss and practice how to reward a dog on articles to build drive for the article and indication. Leash handling through trees, scrub and more will be discussed and practiced!

Eva has been involved in dog sports since 8 years of age. She has trained and titled dogs in Obedience, Rally, Agility, Herding, Retriever Hunt Tests and more and utilizes her diverse training in teaching barn hunt and developing drills to proof and develop teams.
