

### REFLECTION for the First Sunday in Lent.

We are only a few days into the season of Lent. Hopefully each of us are still winning in the struggle to remain faithful to our resolve to pray, to fast, and to give freely.

It is not easy. But let us never forget that Jesus is with us in our struggles. We are made in the image and likeness of God; but our humanity dictates that we will sometimes fail, sometimes doubt, and sometimes get discouraged. Jesus is God and Jesus was human; He knows the mind of mankind. He sits in heaven and intercedes for us-His Holy Spirit dwells with us to show us the Way.

In today's Gospel Jesus is tempted by the Devil in ways that we too are tempted by the Devil. The Devil knows the mind of mankind also. The evil-one knows that we thirst for power and possessions, and that we are filled with pride. We want things and we want them now, we want to be seen as righteous, we like for people to admire us, we know how things should be and we wonder why other people cannot just be like us.

Satan offered all these things to Jesus but he had the strength to resist- He beat the Devil. But He is God, we are but mere mortals. More often than not the Devil beats us.

The key to understanding Jesus and understanding our place in the unfolding of His divine plan of salvation for us is to persevere, to stay focused, to eye the prize, and to hitch our wagon to Jesus.

In humility we must admit our failings, short-comings, and dependence. We are dependent; our salvation can be achieved only through the love of God.

May I suggest that all of us continue trying, continue praying, fasting, and giving? In the fight of our lives, we have to take the punches, we may fall, we may be staggered, but we have the pick ourselves up. We have the trainer- par- excellent. As Christians we belong to Jesus. He assures us that He will never forget us, not leave us orphaned. Praise God! Fr. Don
