THE CROSS OF JOY AND HAPPINESS!

Isaiah 50:4-9; Psalm 116:1-6, 8-9; James 2:14-18; Mark 8:27-35

Don't you and I sometimes wish we could live a life without pain? Yes. it would be awesome to live a life that is pain-free! But that ideal would be contrary to the law of nature where the human body, like any other created material, has to undergo certain changes as it develops and ages. Studies have shown that people who grow up in disadvantaged societies tend to have the capacity to cope with pain and suffering better than those who grow up in affluent ones like ours. Ours is a society that does all it can to do away with the reality of pain and suffering. For some, the reality of pain and suffering is very much incompatible with happiness; thus, they rely heavily on prescribed / non-prescribed painkillers - others depend solely on illegal drugs to make them "feel high" and forget their pain. Some have gone to the ultimate extent of tragically ending their precious lives through suicide in order to "escape" the challenges of pain and suffering. Unfortunately, the society, directly or indirectly, has created the impression that contentment and happiness can only be found where there is less pain or none at all.

A Christian perception of life must be different. As Christians, our lives are fashioned after the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a life where you and I are called to "die to self and live for others." It is a life of the cross! This truth is highlighted in today's gospel passage where Jesus, following Peter's confession that He was the Christ, drew their attention to the fact that it was imperative for Him, "the Son of Man (to) suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days." No one wants the cross for himself or for his loved ones! No one wants to die in agony! Not even Peter!

Although, Peter and the other disciples comprehended that Jesus was the Messiah from God, they still did not understood what that meant. As we sometimes think of any affluent or wealthy person, they thought Christ would be without pain and suffering. Frankly, Jesus becomes understandably disappointed when His followers, you and I, do not know Him well enough: "Get behind me, Satan! You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." This tells us how narrowminded we usually are whenever we think it is sufficient to be a baptized Catholic, but are not willing to embrace pain and suffering, and are not willing to sacrifice our time, talent and treasure for the good of the community. Do not be eager to wear the crown if you are not ready to be pricked by its thorns! Do not be eager to get to heaven if you are not prepared to walk the narrow road! There can be no gains of heaven without the pains of earth. Christian, "What good is it...if someone says he has faith but does not have works?" How can you claim to be a Christian when your actions are contrary to Jesus' teaching on compassion, forthrightness, faithfulness, selflessness and generosity? In fact, a true and authentic Christian "must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me" daily.


Do you really know Who Jesus is? Maybe not, thus, He asks you and me to "Get behind Me..." and learn from Me! He must be the one to lead while we follow. We must always allow Jesus to lead us, no matter how difficult it might seem. As Christians we must see the essence of our life here on earth as that of a sacrificial service. We must put our trust in Christ while abandoning our personal ambition in service for the greater good. Your life as Christian has no meaning unless "You take up (your) cross and follow Me."


