

Yenglin, Mary

Mary Evelyn Yenglin, 79, of Charlevoix and formerly of Pigeon and Lake City, passed away on Monday, December 13, 2004, at Charlevoix Area Hospital. She was born in rural Bad Axe on September 16, 1925, daughter of the late Herb Leopold and Mary Jane (Humphrey) Hebner. On March 1, 1953, she was united in marriage to Clarence E. Yenglin in Bowling Green, Ohio. Mr. Yenglin preceded her in death on October 23, 1989. Mrs. Yenglin worked alongside her husband, Clarence, as former owners of Huron Auto Parts in Bad Axe, Pigeon Auto Supply, and C. Yenglin Trucking Company of Pigeon. While the Yenglins lived in Pigeon, they were very active in the life and the events of the community. They also enjoyed boating and traveling, and together they spent several winters in Arizona. Mrs. Yenglin was a former member of the First United Methodist Church in Pigeon, and while in Pigeon, was a very active member of the Eastern Star. She was also an avid Detroit Lions football fan and followed University of Michigan football with enthusiasm. Her bright spot and the highlight of her activities came when she was able to be with her family, and especially her grandchildren. She is survived by two sons and daughters-in-law, Charles and Paula Yenglin, of Harbor Springs, and Daniel and Barbara Yenglin, of Charlevoix; four grandchildren, Krystal, Kevin, Bailey and Brock; a sister, Agnes Moran, of Pigeon; and several nieces and nephews. Besides her husband, she was preceded in death by three brothers, Howard, Willard, and Jay Hebner, and an infant sister. Funeral committal services were conducted on Thursday, December 16, 2004.
