An Apostolic Faith Believer?

Not many days ago this question flashed through my mind, and how easy it was for me to answer this question! Surely I do not make this statement in a boastful manner but in humbleness of heart and life, for the dear Lord could have left me alone, never taking note of my hungry heart. Praise the Lord that His word tells us, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness for they shall be filled." This is my experience today and has been for 42 years.

In November of 1922 I was baptized with the Holy Ghost, giving me power and authority to do my part in carrying the Apostolic doctrine, which is the message Christ gave to be preached unto the end and unto all nations. I feel thankful to be one called at the eleventh hour, for day is soon done and night is coming when no man can work. But Praise the Lord, we will enter into a new day at the return of the Lord Who said His reward is with Him to give to every man according as his work shall be.

In 1922 messengers with the Gospel of the Kingdom came to our part of the country where Texas and Oklahoma meet, bringing the message to many hungry hearts (of whom I felt I was chief)—the same message which Jesus told His disciples to take into all the world. The first of these messengers were the three Morton Sisters, and others followed.

So many things that had troubled my mind were solved by the word of God going forth under the anointing of the Holy Ghost. When I think of this my heart leaps for joy.

Now back to the question, "Why am I an Apostolic Faith believer?" In Ephesians 2:20-22 the Word of God declares we "are built upon the foundation of the APOSTLES and PROPHETS, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief corner stone, in whom all the building (church) fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord: in whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit." After Christ's resurrection He told His disciples to go and teach all nations to observe whatsoever He had commanded them, and stated He would be with them alway even unto the end of the world. There are many different truths I could bring with pen to you but I will mention only the things which troubled me most. In all of this perplexity, darkness was turned into light by the precious word of God that is forever settled in Heaven. Through earnest seeking, the experience of the Apostles was mine. O how can I praise the Lord for loving me so? I feel only by living the Gospel and telling it to others.

Up to this time repentance was the only message I had heard. And repent I did at the age of 20 years while still in the home of my parents. After repenting I thought the next move was to join the church of which mv parents were members, yet I was puzzled as to whether or not this was the right church for I felt there must be Christians in all denominations of men. This too, was solved by Apostolic teaching.

For, praise the Lord, Jesus said, I am the DOOR, and he that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold (church) the same is a thief and a robber. Jesus also said, "By ME if any man enter in he shall be SAVED, and shall go in and out and find pasture." John, Chapter 10.

In Peter's sermon on the day of Pentecost 3,000 souls were added unto them, and in the same chapter (Acts 2:47) we read that the LORD ADDED TO THE CHURCH daily such as should be saved. Only one church, and the Lord adds the members. It is purchased by the blood of Jesus Christ, for without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin. (Heb. 9:22) Whoever we are. when we repent the blood of Jesus blots out all transgressions and our name is recorded in Heaven in the Lamb's book of life. Not necessarily on the recording book of some man-made organization, for God did not intend for man to try to organize His work. Here let me remind you the earth and the works that are therein are some day to be burned up, so be very sure, my friend, your name is recorded in Heaven.

God loved the world so much that He gave His Son to die for all our sins, and Christ so loved the church (everyone who in repentance has been brought back to God) that He gave Himself for it, and by the one offering His blood cleanses and sanctifies us. as we consecrate and surrender our lives completely unto God. making us as a holy church without spot or wrinkle. When I surrendered all, friends and time and earthly store, and was yoked with Christ I found His yoke was easy and His burden light.

Another thing that puzzled me was the state of the dead. Did the saved go immediately to Heaven, and the unsaved to hell? I wondered where these places were, for all that I knew about went to the grave after death. This problem was solved when I heard of the resurrections, and was told of the spirit returning to God who gave it when breath left the body. In the message of the second coming of the Lord it was revealed to me that when He returned the blessed and holy dead would come forth from the grave, and along with the holy people who are living, would put on immortality and reign with Christ a thousand years. Following this there would be another resurrection when all would stand before God and whosoever's name was not recorded in the book of life would be cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. (Rev. 20: 4-6, 12-15). We heard of the reward of the wickedthey are to be destroyed. In another place it is written "The wages of sin is death" Romans 6:23. So another puzzle was solved, for the words "destruction, perish, death" mean to utterly do away with, so people will not burn on and on but just as long as there is fuel for the fire. (Malachi 4:1).

Another Apostolic teaching which brought joy to my heart was God's plan in supplying the


Our association with Brother Dibbens in this work has been very pleasant and congenial; we express to him our thanks and gratitude.

need of those sent forth with His message. Jesus told His disciples to go without money and without price. "The workman is worthy of his hire" is recorded in another place.

My parents did not have too much of this world's goods and in the church where we met for worship, collections were often taken, asking for offerings commencing with \$100. and coming down to \$5.00, this being about what they could give. It was really an embarrassing situation.

The messengers who came our way told us the gospel was to be preached to the poor. They seldom mentioned money, but when led of the Spirit told us of tithing, offerings and almsgiving. When people receive the Good News of Jesus they are GLAD to support the ones who are pouring out their life to carry the Gospel. A blessing is promised to a cheerful giver. I have found throughout the years that every longing of the heart is satisfied by the Gospel of Good News of Jesus.

By the grace of God I am what I am, and I have nothing that I have not received, therefore I fear lest I displease God and I certainly do not feel puffed up.

When the Gospel in its fulness came our way we were by some called "come-outers" and I am glad that I have done just that, for it is going to pay God's dear children to "come out from among them, and be separate" (2 Cor. 6:17) and not be mixed up with the Federation of Churches. I am "contending for the Faith which was once delivered to the saints" and for the message that was brought to us 20 years after the latter rain fell in Topeka, Kansas in a Bible School under the direction of Charles F. Parham. In this Bible School they had all things in common, no charge for food or anything, as in the beginning of the early church. I have been so happy to have known Brother Parham and that I have heard the message that fell from his lips as well as from others. Brother Parham was the man God used in bringing back or restoring the message of the Baptism of the Holy Ghost as the Wesley Brothers were used with the message of sanctification and divine healing.

And I must tell you that when I heard Jesus healed I humbly came to Him and my voice was restored which had been gone for two and a half years. I have trusted Him fully since that time. Jesus never fails.

I must bring this article to a close. Dear friend, do you realize that the message of repentance, of sanctification, of Divine healing, or of any other truth you may have received was to be sent into the world and first began with the ones who walked and talked with Jesus almost 2000 years ago? Then why marvel that some today are of the APOSTO-LIC FAITH belief? What better Biblical name could you bear?

No longer am I pastor of the Spearman Apostolic Faith Church but here I will be laboring, and if in any way or at any time I can be a help to any individual or to any church within the radius of 100 miles of my home, I will be glad to do so. By His grace, we will work till Jesus comes.
