The Federal Asian Pacific American Council Headquarters (www.fapac.org) was founded in 1985.

FAPAC SW is organized exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The primary purpose of FAPAC SW is to serve as an interagency association providing a focus for over thirty ethnically distinct groups originating from Asian and Pacific regions as recognized by the United States Bureau of the Census.
