NEW BUSINESS

- -Trone informed the board that the riser for the storm sewer on his property is completely disintegrated. Sandberg will ask Haar to get a list of storm sewer so that they can all be inspected to see if anymore need work.
- -PC Sheriff's Office sent bill for \$250 for fees for monthly storm siren testing, software maintenance, etc.

- -Discussed the usage of the park for picnics in July/August. They will need to meet current PHASE guidelines such as less than 50 people in attendance, social distancing. A form will be drafted and sent to the person who reserved the park for signature stating that they will abide by these guidelines.
