HESS ROLLS OVER FIELD FOR CAREER WIN # 6

GREIM STORMS FROM BEHIND TO CAPTURE FIRST TITLE

GREIM GARNERS FIRST GISBT VICTORY

In a 3-way battle, Zach Greim became the tour's newest champion at the 2021-2022 Tournament of Champions. The 2-hander from Poway, California skirmished with Jordan Monnens and Isaac Erickson over the final games of match play to determine who would haul in their first tour title. In the end, it was Greim Time, and the spoils of victory included the beautiful championship trophy, as well as a \$600 scholarship and a permanent place on Champion's Row. In the 293-event history of the Greater Iowa Scholarship Bowling Tour, Greim became the 131st different boy's champion.

In the boy's division, Greim became the 6th first-time champion this season. The others were Corey Roth (August – Big River Bowling), Kai Yamada (September – Maple Lanes), Alex Nolan (October – May City Bowl), Joshua Collins (January – Cadillac XBC) and Joshua Green (April – Big River Bowling). The 6 first-time winners matches the half-dozen first-time champions from the 2018-2019 season.

CHAMP CATCHES FIRE IN MATCH PLAY TO EARN VICTORY

The champ almost didn't qualify for the finals. He struggled during the final 2 games of qualifying, with games of 169 and 170, but it was enough to grab the 8th and final spot in the 8-player finals. Once match play began, the champion made a big move on the lane, changed balls and his final 8 games were an entirely different story. After averaging 199.12 for his first 8 games, Greim's decision-making resulted in a 231.75 average for his final 8 games. He posted an impressive 7-1 match play ledger as well, with his highest 2 games coming during his final 2 games – lines of 248 and 269 which enabled him to take home the win. Heading into those final 2 games, Greim found himself 18 pins out of the lead, but after that sensational finish, his margin of victory was a deceiving 139 pins.

Since the GISBT was founded in 1992, there have been 29 editions of the Tournament of Champions. Amazingly, more than half – 15 – have been won on the boy's side by first-time champions, with Greim becoming the 15th to turn that trick, and the 2nd straight. Jayson Miner captured his first title at the 2020-2021 Tournament of Champions, held this past August at Leisure Lanes in Davenport.

Greim appeared in 5 tour events this season, qualifying for 4 match play finals, and raking in \$1,402.50 in scholarship earnings. For his 16 games in this event, he averaged 215.43. Congratulations, Zach!

MONNENS IN CAREER FORM, TAKES RUNNER-UP

Jordan Monnens was in great form at this season's Tournament of Champions. The 2-handed lefty from Ham Lake, Minnesota logged his best finish on tour – a runner-up showing that netted him a \$450 payday. Monnens entered the position round just 36 pins out of the lead, but was overwhelmed by the eventual champions 269 game. This was the 6th match play finals of his career, and the runner-up finish was his highest finish on tour – bettering the 3rd place showing he recorded at the February 2021 stop in Moline, Illinois.

ERICKSON IN CONTENTION AGAIN, TAKES 3rd

Isaac Erickson continued his role as one of the tour's finest competitors. The Lititz, Pennsylvania native rolled into his 8th match play finals at this month's event; this time out, he finished in 3rd place, garnering a \$325 scholarship. Over the past several seasons, Erickson has flirted with his first tour victory on a number of occasions, and this month, he bowled his way into contention again.

4-TIME TOUR CHAMP SIKKEMA PLACES 4th

Seth Sikkema finished 4th at the 2021-2022 finale. The 2-hander from Fulton, Illinois – already a 4-time tour winner – took home a \$275 scholarship for his 4th place showing. This was the 19th match play finals of his successful career.

DENTON CAPS BOWLER OF YEAR CAMPAIGN WITH 5th PLACE SHOWING

Zack Denton put the cap on the best season of his GISBT career. The right-handed stroker from Waverly, lowa qualified for his 10th match play finals – with half of those coming this season. This month, he finished in 5th place, capturing a \$250 reward for his performance. Denton's consistency throughout 2021-2022 resulted in his Bowler of the Year award, which was presented during opening ceremonies.

TALENTED 45 PLAYER FIELD COMPETES AT SEASON ENDING EXTRAVAGANZA

This season's Tournament of Champions assembled an ultra-impressive starting field. The 45 competitors – who were each announced during opening ceremonies – had collectively amassed 30 tour titles and 209 match play finals appearances.

LUGO PLACES 6th

Luis Lugo, one of 3 past champions in this month's boy's finals field, finished 6th. The smooth-rolling righthander from Mexico earned a \$225 Lugo, who earned his tour victory during last season's competition, was appearing in the 5th match play finals of his career.

2-TIME TOUR CHAMP COLLINS FINISHES 7th

Joshua Collins was this month's 7th place finisher. On the strength of his back-to-back victories at the January and February tour stops, the talented southpaw was named as the 2021-2022 Rookie of the Year in opening ceremonies. This was the 4th match play finals of his career, and the Fortson, Georgia native hauled in a \$200 payday as a result of his performance. Collins was one of 2 southpaws in this month's boy's finals field.

BIERI TAKES 8th

Keaten Bieri, one of the GISBT's most promising young players, rounded out this month's match play finals field. It was the second 8th place finish of the season for the talented 16 year-old from Letts, Iowa; he also finished in 8th place at the February tour stop at Cedar Rapids Bowling Center.

HESS BUILDS HUGE LEAD IN QUALIFYING

DOMINATES FIELD IN WINNING CAREER TITLE # 6

HESS DOMINANT IN CAPTURING 6th TOUR CROWN

Megan Hess tamed a challenging lane pattern, and opened up a huge qualifying round lead that proved to be insurmountable, and she coasted through match play to log the 6th win of her prolific tour career. The right-hander from Granger, Iowa was hotter than fresh baked bread in her qualifying round, as she set a torrid pace, averaging 222.12 for her first 8 games. She finished at +177 – easily the highest score in the building. This enabled her to break away from the pack and tote a 223 pin lead into the match play finals

The champion staged all 6 of her finals matches between 173 and 211, winning 4 and losing 2, and despite a 236-204 loss to Addy Nelson, the runner-up finisher, her margin of victory was still 188 pins. She reeled in the beautiful championship trophy, and a \$500 paycheck – the largest of her GISBT career.

This was the 15th match play finals of Hess' career, and this was also the most dominant of her 6 victories. She's now won in 4 different centers during her career – Highland Park Bowl, Cadillac XBC, 3 times at May City Bowl and now Hi-Five Lanes as well. For her 14 games, Hess averaged 210.07. Congratulations, Megan!

3-TIME CHAMP NELSON TAKES RUNNER-UP

Addy Nelson finished as this month's runner-up. The stroker from Gregory, South Dakota reeled in a \$350 scholarship for her day's work. Nelson, a 3-time GISBT champion, was appearing in the 13th match play finals of her career.

BILLS PLACES 3rd

Marissa Bills was this month's 3rd place performer. The talented right-hander from Marion, Iowa earned a \$250 scholarship for her performance. This marked the 4th match play finals of her blossoming career, and her best effort since a runner-up showing at the season opener in Davenport.

BODMAN BAGS 4th

Lauren Bodman returned to the match play finals for the 2nd time in her tour career; this time out she finished in 4th place, bagging a \$200 scholarship for her efforts. The Fruitland, Iowa native was the only southpaw in this month's girl's finals field.

MADISON COMPLETES SENSATIONAL SEASON BY FINISHING 5th

Brynna Madison rolled into another match play finals round – the 9th of her career – at this season's final tour event. The slender stroker from Lincoln, Nebraska finished in 5th place, hauling in a \$175 scholarship for her performance. Madison became the center of attention over the past 9 months, as she racked up high finish after high finish. Over the past 9 tour events, she's garnered 3 tour titles, a pair of runner-up finishes, and has qualified for 8 match play finals. Her consistent shotmaking enabled her to reel in the 2021-2022 Bowler of the Year trophy – the first of her career.

DUVER-BORROZ CLOSES CAREER WITH 6th PLACE FINISH

Hanna Duver-Borroz closed the books on the longest career in GISBT history, as she was appearing in her 87th and final tour event. This month, the right-hander from Indianola, Iowa rolled into the 36th match play finals of her legendary career. She finished 6th, earning a \$150 scholarship.

DUVER COMPETES IN 87th AND FINAL GISBT EVENT

"I can't believe I've been doing this for more than half my life," exclaimed Hanna Duver-Borroz after her amazing, yet lengthy career finally came to close after Sunday's Tournament of Champions. The 4-time GISBT champion had just put the finishing touches on a stellar career which began more than 12 years ago – in March 2010.

Over the past 12 years, she competed in 87 out of the 115 events that were staged. Last season, she broke the record established by her brother for most tournaments bowled in the history of the GISBT, and this season, she added 7 more events to that total to finish with a whopping 87 events bowled. The Indianola, lowa resident enjoyed the longest career in the 30-season history of the GISBT.

Last season, Duver bowled in her 80th tour event, which established a new tour record. Ironically, she bested her older brother Mitchell, who rolled in 79 tour events in his career. She added 7 more to her record in 2021-2022, and finishes her career as the only player in tour history to reach the 80 tournament plateau. There have been 10 others who have competed in at least 70 events.
