

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Lk 20:27-38

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

School debate coaches suggest that we often argue against ourselves in controversies. Some advise us to, "Let your opponent speak." It takes patience to resist the instinct to get in the first and last word. But anyone who has observed a child's tantrum, knows well that the weakest argument in the crowd is the loudest that tries to drown out everything else. Another childish trick is to sensationally exaggerate a point that just shocks a person into a muted disbelief, or distracts us by pulling in other high-emotion arguments into the same issue (fear/coercion).

Think of the child who screams he is going to die if he doesn't get French fries now! But if a patient examination of the issue is performed, truth shines to reveal its own internal consistency and coherence. So, if the other person speaks truth, then embrace it because that is no threat. We claim to be in the truth, too. If they speak falsely, simply point it out. Yet, sometimes cleverly in debate a person introduces a staged question, framed into a false set-up that stretches the truth by emphasizing a rare consequence or unpleasant side effect. Now, I didn't mean to wander into debate tactics or the dialectics of rhetoric, but such manipulative tricks are what the Sadducees are up to in the gospel reading today.

Not surprisingly, the opening line of the gospel lays out what position the Sadducees want Jesus to support for them. Simply, they do not believe in a resurrection. Luke 20: 27, says '**Sadducees, who deny that there is a resurrection,** came forward and questioned Jesus...' So they bring an extreme case- example that contorts the idea of resurrection into an awkward position. They basically invent a story so unlikely, such that a woman ends up marrying seven different brothers, due to their deaths each time. Then they ask Jesus, 'By whose side will she sit at the heavenly banquet table?' Jesus hears them out, entertaining such an improbable event, and then simply suggests that placing heaven alongside earth short-circuits any comparison (the old 'apples to oranges' response). Using such a lopsided comparison, is like assuming that the 120 volt wiring of a home can carry the 200,000 volts of the cross-country high transmission lines. Or, in a steak dinner, they are comparing the taste of the parsley garnish to the meaty T-bone. I think of the Sadducees as like my little nephew at Christmas, stuck admiring the wrapping paper of a present, instead of opening it up and enjoying the gift within! The Sadducees are hung up on the earthly functions of marriage such as its exclusive bond to protect the birth and raising of children to perpetuate a family name. But in doing this, they are at the ocean's edge worried about a splash of wave mist, not realizing the magnitude, the depth and breadth of water in front of them. If we try to compare life in heaven to life on earth, we've lost before we begin. **They are two entirely different orders of being.** Marriage and a person's biological family-line on earth is one level, but how we relate to one another in heaven is a **completely new order** of relating to others! What does marriage and parenting down here on earth mean for heaven? There in heaven, we are all children of God in one eternal family. According to the Bible, **that the Sadducees should know,** Isaiah 54:5 says that the only marriage in heaven that counts is the marriage of God to humanity. Isaiah says to the People of God, "For your husband is your Maker; the LORD of hosts is his name". In the New Testament, Jesus, who is the resurrection and the life (John 11:25) describes himself as the 'Bridegroom' (Mark 2:19, Luke 5:34, Matthew 9:15). The Book of Revelation 19:7-9 describes the wedding feast of the Lamb (Jesus) to His People, and St Paul spells it all out in Ephesians 5:25, comparing the church to a beloved bride given in marriage to Christ. So, when we speak about life in heaven, the earthly purposes of marriage with child-bearing and perpetuating a family name are fulfilled and left behind, as heaven is so much more. Heaven is 'light-years' beyond our earthly experience. St Paul later says of it that "Eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and it has not entered the human heart, what God has ready for those who love Him" (1 Corinthians 2:9). So Jesus grants that the Sadducees have not considered the (+infinity) beyond of eternity. They are not open to earth being transcended. Jesus tries with them, though, prying open their earth-bounded example, by referring them to God's Word which was accepted by them. He shows that Moses hinted at more than an earthly longevity, by the fact that God named Himself at the burning bush episode (Exodus 3:6) by saying, "I am the God of your father, ... **the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.**" They are all alive to God. This God of every generation creates and knows and holds them all in His presence. So, again, to God and for our eternity, **the only familial bond that matters in heaven is being a child of God with everyone else.** In heaven, there is no family privilege or preference except being a member of God's household with every other sibling! So to the Sadducees, if they want to remain earthbound and dependent on a human dynasty, okay-fine, but it is theirs for only a little while. But, if you want to ascend to heaven, 'seeking what is above' (Colossians 3:1), then enter the universal and eternal family of Christ opened to us in baptism!
