

27<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Year C Luke 17:5-10



"The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. "Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'

# Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

27<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Year C Luke 17:5-10

Be careful what you pray for! As the gospel opens today, the apostles ask of Jesus, "Increase our faith" (Luke 17:5). I made a list once of 'regretted requests', which are requests that you think twice about after having made them. I find several good candidates of regret in different requests that are made of Jesus in the gospels. Maybe like James & John's selfish demand of 'glory seats' alongside Jesus (Mark 10:37) or Peter's request to 'walk on water' (Matt 14:28). I think today's request by the apostles makes the list. Supposing that the request is fulfilled just as they wanted, imagine them now realizing the increased responsibility and consequences of commitment that come with it. Whenever I've heard about organizational 'ladder-climbers', and people feeling the burden of their high offices, there's always a cynic in every group that remarks, 'Those who desire such positions, deserve them!' How many times have we sought something only to receive it, and the other things attached to it, and knew that we brought that regret upon ourselves! For example in this case, If I have pray for an increase of faith, how will I ever know my faith is strengthened until it is tested past previous limits? It is the extra push that leads me to discover the newly added faith. Or consider patience as a specific example: How will I know I have more patience, unless I've endured extra testing of it to demonstrate my newly given patience?

So I need to be humble about what I pray for and prepare to embrace the additional responsibility of having any prayers answered! If my prayer is answered, then God may ask more of me to use such gifts for His greater glory! Jesus does say in Luke 12:48 "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." So, Pray-er Beware!

Also, Jesus celebrates the role of servant in this passage. Servants, while typically not ever acknowledged, they are the ones who actually hold the whole structure together. Like the ship engine room workers who never see the light of day, they are the ones powering the ship!. Or stage hands that construct the set, control lights and raise curtains, good ones are never seen themselves, but they are the ones who enable the show to go on! It is the same with servants in the kingdom of God. Christians are those servants! And of course Christians are the 'roadies' of life, just as the first Christians were called 'Members of the Way-(The Road-Acts 9:2. We find Jesus in the center of us as 'servant to the servants', especially at the Last Supper (where of all places the apostles start arguing who is greatest). Jesus responds to their silly argument by, 'washing their feet' (John 13:5) and saying to them, "let the greatest among you be as the youngest, and the leader as the servant. For who is greater: the one seated at table or the one who serves? ........ I am among you as the one who serves. (Luke 22:26-27).

And speaking of the *power of little things* (lowly servants bearing great responsibility), Jesus calls us to 'mustard seed living'. Acts of faith even the size of mustard seeds, from those smallest beginnings can result the most wondrous of fruits. Cultivate it and watch it increase! This shouldn't surprise us, that tremendous power can be released from the tiniest of things. Jesus tells us that faith the size of a mustard seed can uproot trees and plant them in the sea (Luke 17:6) I am not sure which is more impressive, the complete uprooting of a tree, or its subsequent 'planting' and growing in the salty sea (*primitive hydroponic farming?*) but we are aware of the nuclear power released when an atom is split! Who would have thought such extreme force could come from a tiny atom? Or have we ever watched simple soft water flowing over a rock and wear a path into the hard stone? Or how about a slender vine growing into the brick along a house, later splitting apart the mortar joints or brick itself? Or have you seen sidewalks (& home foundations) broken up and raised because of tree roots growing underneath? From such small things, the strongest of materials are melted away, and their hardness broken up. Jesus tells us 'faith' achieves such ends too. Even as small a start as a mustard seed, given time, can overcome and accomplish the greatest results. So, however much faith we have, little or great, if we activate it by our use, we can trust it to be great fruit and do great things.


