14 families came to help in the garden on 9th November. Many thanks for all your help.


There will be another Garden Project morning in the Spring; we will send details nearer the time.

Settling in Survey

We had 38 responses to our survey about settling in. Thank you to all those who responded; we do welcome feedback.

There was much positive feedback about procedures put in place to support children to settle in to the nursery school, including the visits to school, the home visits and the meetings with the key person. This has been shared with the staff team.

Some respondents felt that the settling in process was a little long. We have approximately 100 new children each September and have to consider very carefully how to organise admissions successfully. We believe that children's wellbeing is crucial to their successful learning and their first experience at school should be positive. For this reason, we need to give time for children to get to know and build an attachment with their key person before the parent leaves. We therefore ask parents/carers to make themselves available for a week when their child starts with us. We do appreciate that many of our parents have work commitments but, from many years of experience, have found that investing this time at the beginning pays off.

Although there is information about settling in given in the Welcome Pack at the Summer visit to school, it seems that some aspects of the process were unclear and we will review the information for the Sept 2020 intake.

We do appreciate you taking the time to feedback so that we can continually review and amend our practice if necessary.
