The Woodward Mansion Our medal ~ Viva Fiesta 2021

The 2021 WCSA Fiesta Medal design celebrates our early Fiesta history and showcases our beautiful home! The Woodward Mansion is a classic revival style home designed by Atlee B. Ayers and built over a two-year period (1907-1908). The mansion was built by David J. Woodward as a gift for his wife, May, who later became a member of the Woman's Club.

Mr. Woodward was prominent in our early San Antonio Fiesta history. At the time the mansion was being built, David Woodward belonged to a men's group that celebrated Fiesta. The men named their group OMALA (Alamo spelled backwards). They had a king and he had a court. The king was King SELAMAT (tamales spelled backwards). The first King Selamat, the first King of Fiesta, was David Woodward. A photograph sketch of King Selamat appeared in the San Antonio Daily News on April 25, 1905.

Fiesta's first event was the Battle of Flowers Parade organized by women who wanted to honor the heroes of the battles for Texas Independence and held April 24, 1891. The Woman's Club of San Antonio, founded in 1898, participated in early Battle of Flowers parades. Men's groups would add many traditions to Fiesta including royal courts. Perhaps as early organizers of Fiesta events David and May entertained a Court of Omala in their new home at 1717 San Pedro. David Woodward passed away in 1925. The Women's Club purchased the home from May in 1926, the same year the Texas Cavaliers was formed. The first King Antonio was crowned in 1927.

To have a 2021 WCSA Fiesta Medal and to give this medal as a gift is a way to share the story of the earliest days of our city's wonderful tradition and of our own organization. Our beautiful 2021 medal with its rich history is for sale for only \$12! Wear it proudly and think about the Woodward Mansion and David Woodward, King Selamat I.
