Dear OLSS Families,

One week from today is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, one of the most important seasons in the Church's liturgical year. Lent is a time of preparation for the celebration of Christ's Death and Resurrection at Easter. Lasting 40 days – from Ash Wednesday to the evening of Holy Thursday – the season draws us towards the light of Christ and closer to God. At our school, we will observe Lent with the following events:

MARDI GRAS/ SHROVE TUESDAY: TUESDAY, FEB. 21

- Tuesday, Feb. 21 is a \$1 Mardi Gras Tag Day; students can wear, purple, green, & yellow. Donations will go to the Sisters of Divine Providence to assist residents in the Nazareth Home Retirement Community.
- Students made Mardi Gras masks in Art and will have a parade at the end of the school day (time TBA).
- Hot lunch that day is pancakes as it is Shrove Tuesday, which comes from the word shrive, meaning "absolve".

ASH WEDNESDAY: WEDNESDAY, FEB. 22

- Students will attend the 9am Mass; family members are welcome to attend.
- We will receive ashes on our foreheads at the Mass, which symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: FRIDAYS DURING LENT

- Students will attend Stations of the Cross together every Friday in the Parish Church.
- The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth. The stations focus on specific events of His last day. At each station, we recall and reflect with specific prayers.
