#### **ROAD WORK NOTICE**

The Iowa County Engineer's Office, in conjunction with the Iowa County Board of Supervisors, has contracted West Fork Grinding to diamond grind 38th Ave and C St, between Middle and Main Amana. The Iowa County Board of Supervisors understands the importance the RV park and Event Center has on the Amana community, and this project will significantly improve the ride quality for the campers.

During the construction process different sections of the road may be closed to through traffic. However, access to the RV Park & Event Center shall be maintained. The project is expected to start in late October and may take up to a month to complete.

#### **School Board Elections on November 7** Meet the Candidates October 24

The Clear Creek Amana School Board election and PPEL renewal vote will be on Tuesday, Nov. 7. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.

A "Candidates Forum" for all CCA candidates will beheld Tuesday. October 24 at the CCA High School Performing Arts auditorium in Tiffin. It will start at 6 p.m. This is a chance to meet and hear from each candidate.

Members of the Clear Creek Amana Board of Education consist of three at large Directors, and four District Directors that serve a specific geographic area of the District. The Amana Colonies are in Director District 1. Directors serve the students and citizens of the school district and they serve four year terms. CCA registered voters can vote for all districts and at-large seats.

At-large directors can live anywhere within the CCA school district boundaries and district directors must live within the boundaries of their district.
