#### OFFICER'S DUTIES

#### **Officers**

Officers are elected annually by ballot from among the Active members of the Society. The office is held for one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

#### President

- Preside at all meetings (by-laws article VII)
- Perform duties customary to the office (by-laws article VII)
- Appoint committees as deemed necessary (by-laws article VIII)
- Designate date and time of board meetings (by-laws article VI)
- Serve as ex-officio chairperson of the Board of Directors (by-laws article VI)
- Serve on board of directors as past-president (following year) (by-laws article VI)

#### Vice President

- Preside at all meetings and perform all the duties of the President in his absence or inability to serve (by-laws article VII)
- Arrange monthly meeting program (CD/DVD, demonstration, speaker, etc)
- Handout door prize tickets during break

#### Cab of the Month:

- Turn on light over cabs on laminated sheet
- Ensure voting paper and pencils are available
- Count votes and provide winning cab number to President

#### Gold Pan:

- Encourage donations
- Inform members of new items available
- Collect donation monies and give to Treasurer

#### Secretary

- Keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Society and of the Board of Directors (by-laws Article VII) email to editor
- Serve as ex-officio secretary of the Board of Directors (by-laws Article VI)
- If unable to attend a meeting, assign a Board of Directors member to act on your behalf
- Receive new membership application (from Treasurer)
- Provide Editor with new member name, address, and birthday
- Maintain master files; Society records, correspondence, approved minutes, and forms
- Mail sympathy and get well cards to members and notify President
- Notify all applicants of election (by-laws Article VII)
- Answer the routine correspondence of the Society (by-laws Article VII)
- Maintain and update Society membership directory (Treasurer provides paid status and application). Provide members with annual membership directory
- Pick up the mail and distribute as necessary

Some gems, such as Campbellite and Mohawkite, are a conglomeration of several metals and other minerals.

#### **Treasurer**

- Receive all dues and other monies, and disburse same when authorized by the Board of Directors (by-laws Article VII)
- Keep a full and accurate account of such transactions and render a report to the Society upon request (by-laws Article VII)
- Deposit monies in the Society's accounts
- Provide a yearly written report at each annual meeting (by-laws Article VII)
- Provide report to the Board of Directors or the President when requested (by-laws Article VII)
- Perform such other duties as the Board of Directors or the Society shall direct (by-laws Article VII)
- Provide updates to Secretary for membership directory
- Give new member application to Secretary for filing
- Keep accurate records of all accounts using an approved accounting method
- Ascertain the Society's insurance requisites for property and liability
- Prepare and remit taxes as necessary
- Responsible for paying scholarships directly to the school for the recipients
- Provide books to Board of Directors on December 31st for auditing (by-laws Article VII)

#### **Board of Directors**

Board of Directors consist of the officers of the Society as members ex-officio, the immediate past president, and five Active members of the Society elected at large at the time of the regular election of officers.

The President of the Society is the ex-officio chairperson and the Secretary is the ex-officio secretary of the Board of Directors.

- Approve those proposed for Honorary Membership (by-laws Article III)
- Shall meet at such times as the President shall designate (by-laws Article VI)
- Conduct business of the Society and shall have general management and control of all Society property, effects and assets (by-laws Article VII)
- Remit dues, make suggestions for rules and regulations as in their judgment are necessary and proper . . . (by-laws Article VII)
- Possess such other powers and perform such other duties as the Society shall prescribe (by-laws Article VII)
- Appoint an auditor to audit the books of the outgoing Treasurer and report at the annual meeting (by-laws Article VII)
- May hold special meetings (by-laws Article IX)
