# Marianne Reisinger Sep 27, 1936-Sep 27, 2017



Marianne was born in Germany and lived there until adulthood. She was married to an American G.I. who sadly was killed in an auto accident. She later married Fritz Reisinger, a jovial businessman in Colorado Springs.

She is survived by her son Charles A. Powell, a brother Wolfgang Wittemaier, and a sister Inge lillheim.

Marianne was President of the Germania Club when it was the largest, most active ethnic organization in the area. She organized and led many of its activities including the club's bar, social room, and bingo operations in its own building.

Becoming friends with the leadership of Fjellheim Lodge, she introduced them to Bingo possibilities, encouraged its pursuit, and taught its procedures. Thus began a very productive fund raising effort that resulted in the purchase of Viking Hall. She not only instructed us, she also frequently supported our efforts by playing.

Later, she joined the Lodge and became our Bingo Manager for a number of years, raising a sizeable amount for us. She was tireless in her efforts on our behalf.

We remember her with thankfulness and admiration.


