



MAX MONT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Max Mont helped establish the Trade Tech Labor Center and championed social and economic justice issues during his 40 years as Executive Director of the L. A. Jewish Labor Committee. The L. A. County Federation of Labor established a scholarship fund in his honor to help students attend Trade Tech Labor Studies classes.

Max Mont Scholarships help students and workers develop union leadership skills while earning a Labor Studies Certificate or AA Degree (scholarships available only until students complete 36 units in Labor Studies required for the AA Degree).

Partial Scholarship: Students pay enrollment fees for the first 3 units of Labor Studies classes each semester and the Scholarship reimburses enrollment fees for additional Labor Studies classes after the first 3 units at the CA resident rate of \$46/unit. *Maximum award for partial scholarship: \$276 per semester.*

Full Scholarship: *To qualify, you must complete 24 units,* then enrollment fees going forward for all Labor Studies classes reimbursed up to a *maximum award: \$414/ semester* at the CA resident rate of \$46/unit.

The Scholarship committee requests that all scholarship candidates apply for financial aid. Students who qualify can receive a BoG fee waiver or other financial aid, thus preserving more funds for students who do not qualify.

Qualifications: Effective Fall 2011, the student must:

1. Be enrolled at LATTC in college credit Labor Studies classes in the current semester;
2. Apply for financial aid, but NOT be currently receiving financial aid, BOGG fee waiver, union or employer reimbursement;
3. Successfully complete classes with passing grades (C or better or CR in 1-unit classes)

Scholarships mailed 6 weeks after the end of each semester.
