New this year was the Pre-Christmas Happy Hour held December 14. Gord played music. A little singing, a little dancing, lots of laughs!




A number of residents attended the New Year's Party and welcomed in the New Year.

TRASH PROCEDURES AKA TRASH TALK!

HOUSEHOLD TRASH

EAST SIDE DUMPSTER: -For residents of Orange Drive and Palm Tree Drive ONLY, who are being charged a fee by the City for this service:



All garbage placed inside the dumpster must be in sealed or tied garbage bags of any size. Nothing is to be placed outside the bin; the City will not pick up anything outside the bin. Pick up days are MONDAY & FRIDAY. January, February, and

- gypsum (drywall)

- animal carcasses

- paints, solvents, or any liquids

- TVs or computer monitors

March there will be a third pickup on WEDNESDAY.

The City has provided the following rules regarding what is **NOT ALLOWED** in the bin: - automobile tires

-Propane tanks or cylinders

-Lead-acid batteries (e.g. car batteries)

-Hazardous materials (e.g. pesticides)

-Brush or tree trimmings

-Used oil or oil filters

-Medical waste (e.g. syringes)

WEST SIDE PICKUP: Thursdays – The trash must be placed in the brown Waste

Management Bags which can be purchased by calling 800-383-0519 and paying online or arranging to leave a check. The bags will be delivered to your home. West Side households do NOT use the dumpster.

- hot ashes

COMMON AREA TRASH and SWIMMING POOL COVERING DUTY

These duties are provided by resident volunteers. The signup sheet is in the Rec. Hall, as is a copy of these instructions. If you are able and have not already done so, please consider taking a week.

Each week starts on a Thursday and includes putting out the trash. **By 5:30 PM Thursday** evening, the trash should be emptied from the hall, including both bathrooms, the barn, and the **Pool Room**; and along with the trash from the bins behind the office building, placed on the right side of the curb in front of the office building. Only six bags of trash can be placed out at one time. Clean 45-gallon garbage bags need to be put into the emptied garbage cans in the bin. Bags are kept in the narrow cupboard by the kitchen trashcan. None of this trash is to be placed in the dumpster.

During your week you are also responsible for uncovering and covering the pool. Remember two people must do this and if the outside temperature is below 70, the pool is NOT to be uncovered.

There are no set times to uncover the pool, so if you wish to use it, you are welcome to take the cover off if it has not been done, provided the temperature is 70 or above and there are two of you.



REMINDERS: - To all who use suntan lotion while on the lounge chairs – please cover the chair with a towel or pad as the oils and lotions deteriorate the vinyl. Be sure to shower before using the pool, and please do not use soap or shampoo in the shower; as the shower drain is not going to a septic tank.

The use of the pool is restricted to owners, their tenants, their overnight guests, or contract purchasers who reside on the property. - no exceptions, please. (as per Article II, Section 2.2, Covenants and Bylaws)


SVV MEN'S & LADIES' GOLF

FREE WALKING TOURS OF HISTORIC DOWNTOWN

Did you know the founder of Harlingen named the city after a fishing and shipping town in the Netherlands?

Take a guided walking tour through historic downtown Harlingen and learn this and many other surprising facts about the events landmarks and businesses along East Jackson Street.

Downtown Harlingen, a designated Texas Main Street district, offers the free walking tours every Saturday at 9 AM with the exception of the first Saturday of the month, which is Jackson Street Market Days.

The walk lasts 90 minutes, so participants are asked to wear comfortable shoes and dress for the weather.

"We encourage locals to take advantage of these free tours of the Downtown area to learn more about Harlingen history, the businesses and the murals, said Downtown Manager, Edward Meza.

"Many locals who have taken the tour are amazed about the history of Downtown and Harlingen,"

The group meets at J&B's Café, 204 E. Jackson Street, and goes through the Historic District, including stops at 10 murals and various historic buildings.

RECIPES

This is a new addition to our newsletter. When we have a standout recipe that everyone has enjoyed at a dinner or an event, we will try to publish the recipe.

Debbie Bates's open house had everyone talking about her stuffed mushrooms, and at the Christmas dinner, one of our new residents, Bev Howard, brought a chocolate mint dessert that everyone liked. Those recipes follow. If you have a request for a recipe everyone would like, let Pam Buhr or Diane Coulter know.

Deb's Stuffed Mushrooms

- Appx. 48 medium-large whole mushrooms cleaned, and stems removed.
- 1 pkg. any flavor desired Stove Top Stuffing, prepared per pkg instructions.
- 1 lb. any type Breakfast Sausage, cooked, drained and crumbled. (I use low fat)
- 1 cup shredded Parmesan Cheese

Combine prepared stuffing, sausage and cheese with 1 beaten egg until sausage is distributed. Stuff each mushroom with mixture, heaping and rounded. Place stuffed mushrooms in single layer on large baking sheet. At this point you may sprinkle each mushroom with some shredded Parmesan cheese. Lightly drizzle all mushrooms with Extra Virgin Olive Oil. Bake in 425° oven for 12-15 mins. Transfer to serving platter and serve warm.

Bev's Chocolate Mint Eclair Dessert

- 23 whole chocolate graham crackers
- 3 cups cold fat-free milk
- 2 packages (3.3 to 3.4 ounces each) instant white chocolate or vanilla pudding mix
- 1/2 teaspoon mint or peppermint extract
- 3 to 4 drops green food coloring, optional
- 1 carton (8 ounces) frozen reduced-fat whipped topping, thawed

Chocolate Frosting:

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 2 tablespoons baking cocoa
- 2 tablespoons plus 1 teaspoon fat-free milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar

Coat a 13-in. x 9-in. dish with cooking spray. Break five whole graham crackers in half; line the bottom of pan with three half crackers and six whole crackers.

In a large bowl, whisk milk, pudding mix, extract and food coloring if desired for 2 minutes (mixture will be thick). Fold in whipped topping.

Spread half over graham crackers. Top with a another layer of three half and six whole crackers. Top with remaining pudding mixture and graham crackers (save remaining half cracker for another use). Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours.

For frosting, melt butter in a saucepan. Stir in cocoa and milk until blended. Remove from the heat; stir in vanilla and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Spread over dessert. Cover and refrigerate overnight.
