
A 57-year-old man from Eastpointe, Michigan, a suburb of Detroit, was given the wrong lottery ticket. But there was no mistake about the result: a \$2 million winner. The Michigan Lottery says the man, who asked that his name not be released, stopped at a convenience store/ gas station to put air in one of his tires. He needed change for the air machine and went inside to the cashier. While there he also asked for a \$10 Lucky 7's scratchoff ticket. "The clerk handed me the \$20 ticket by mistake," the man said. "(The clerk) offered to exchange it, but something told me to keep it. I am sure glad I did!" The winner chose to take a lump sum award of roughly \$1.3 million.

The Illinois Lottery has announced its newest instant ticket, Booming Bucks, which raises funds specifically for science, technology, engineering, art and math programs in Illinois public schools. It is the first lottery in the country to have an instant ticket that specifically supports these types of programming. The Booming Bucks ticket costs \$2 and gives players the chance to win up to \$20,000. The specialty ticket is one of nine in the Illinois Lottery's portfolio of instant tickets that support special causes. Since 2006, the Illinois Lottery has directed more than \$50 million through specialty ticket sales.

The former Pot O' Gold Bingo Hall has now found new life as "Northern Lights Bingo." Located at 3776 Connelly Ave. in Arden Hills, the Bingo hall didn't remain closed for long. After a few months of shuttered doors and empty hall activity, the hall will reemerge once again with the bustling sights and sounds of bingo happenings. Virtual Bingo Wellness Event

Online get-togethers continue to be the name of the game as Covid-19 restrictions remain in place. NorthLakes Community Clinic in Ashland, Wisconsin, for example, held a health-oriented Bingo game online this summer. The clinic created the online Bingo so that staff members could connect with patients and communities, encourage wellness and have fun. Players downloaded Bingo cards from a website. The squares on the cards followed a wellness theme, with challenges such as "walked five days in a row," "meditated," or "brushed and flossed." Winning Bingo cards were submitted to the clinic online and by mail. A prize drawing was held during National Health Center Week.





Louisiana Diners Bite into Bingo

EatLafayette is a summer dining campaign that encourages people to support local eateries in Lafavette, Louisiana, from June to September. More than 100 local restaurants participate in EatLafayette, offering discounts to better compete with chain restaurants. This year, organizers introduced Feed the Envie Bingo to further bolster participation in EatLafayette. (Envie is a French term for an extreme desire or craving for something, usually food.) A printable Bingo card was made available with three entry levels: Across/Down (5 restaurants), Letter L (10 restaurants) or Blackout (25 restaurants). Completed cards with receipts of purchases of \$10 or more, and one \$20 purchase for Blackout participants, were submitted to receive a prize and be entered to win a grand prize.

Bingo Tourism Iowa

Residents of, and visitors to, the Winneshiek County, Iowa region were encouraged to take in the sights courtesy of the Decorah, Iowa newspaper, Driftless Journal, and its featured game-Driftless Journeys Bingo-and earn a complementary commemorative **Driftless Journeys T-shirt and** prize drawing entry. To play, participants took a selfie visiting locations or completing actions on the Bingo card. Players scored Bingo by completing five squares in a row and emailing the five photos corresponding to the Bingo squares. Players could also get a Blackout by completing all 25 squares, earning them a T-shirt along with five entries in a drawing for prizes from the Driftless Journal and local partners.



Get Out and Grill

¹/₄ cup olive oil

- 1 cup breadcrumbs
- 2 garlic cloves

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese

¹/₄ cup pine nuts

¹/₄ cup chopped fresh Italian parsley 1 tablespoon chopped herbs, such as basil, thyme or oregano 1 egg, beaten

6 red, yellow or orange bell peppers Mince the garlic cloves to a

paste with a pinch of salt and set aside. Slice the eggplant into ¹/₄-inch thick slices. Salt lightly and set aside on paper towels to drain for 30 minutes. Rinse lightly and pat dry. Chop coarsely. In a large skillet, heat the oil and sauté the eggplant over high heat until browned and tender, approximately 5 minutes. Chop the cooked eggplant and combine it with the breadcrumbs, garlic paste, Parmesan cheese, pine nuts, parsley and herbs in a bowl. Add the beaten egg and mix well. Cut the tops off the peppers and remove and discard the seeds and whitish core from both the tops and from inside the peppers. Reserve the tops. Stuff the eggplant mixture loosely into the peppers. Secure the tops to the peppers with toothpicks. Cook the peppers in a covered grill over a medium-hot to low fire for 1 hour, turning occasionally. Serves 6.

Don't Be Afraid to Go All In

Sometimes in poker, your opponents will let you win a hand that you have no business winning.

This hand is from a \$1,500-buyin tournament I played not long ago. With blinds at 300-600 plus a big blind ante of 600, a player who had been fairly aggressive from late position raised to 1,600 out of his 35,000 stack from the cutoff. A loose, passive player called from the button. Sitting in the big blind, I decided to three-bet to 6,600 as a bluff with Qs 10c.

Playing out of position with a hand such as Q-10, three-betting is almost always a better play than calling, because when you call, you have to hit the flop in order to win unless you happen to run a huge bluff postflop. When you three-bet, you give yourself

the chance to win preflop as well as postflop whether or not you connect with the board.

Both of my opponents called, which was not ideal. The flop came Kc Qh 4h.

I bet 7,200 into a pot of 20,700. My plan was to take a cheap stab at the pot and fold if either player pushed all in. If either player called, I was going to check the turn unless I improved my hand.

The initial raiser called, and the button folded. In this situation, I would generally expect my opponent to show up with a king, J-10 or maybe a hand such as Q-J. I'm in bad shape against most of that range, which means I should give up on the pot.

The turn was the beautiful 10s.

Since the initial raiser had only 20,000 in chips left and there was already 35,100 in the pot, I decided to go all in. I didn't see how he could fold any hand he called with on the flop, as even J-10 would give him a pair, and he would now be getting decent odds.

He instantly called with Ah Qc. The river blanked, and I ended up winning a nice pot.

If my opponent had gone all in preflop or postflop, he would have forced me off my hand and picked up a nice pot with no risk of going broke. Instead, he allowed me and the button to see a cheap flop, which gave both of us a chance to outdraw him.

I'm all for letting your opponents stay in when they are drawing to three outs. But when the pot is large preflop and you have a hand that is decently

strong, you should almost always try to pick it up.

If the flop had been K 9 4 instead of KQ4, I would have made the same continuation bet and probably would have forced my opponent off his A-Q. My opponent managed to turn a profitable preflop all-in opportunity, which would have let him pick up a decent-sized pot with little risk, into a disaster where he went broke.

Putting yourself into simple spots in tournaments is a way to avoid trouble, and in this spot my opponent did the exact opposite. When you have a strong hand in a tournament and there is a lot of money in the pot preflop, don't be afraid to take a little risk and go all in.


