One evening, Ravy gave the children the opportunity to share about their life before coming to Hannah's Hope. Their stories provide a glimpse into their backgrounds.



Seyha and Seyhak said, "I had five siblings. When I was living in my hometown, I had no food, clothing or money. My father died in a car accident when I was 10 years old. And I always steal something from someone.





Sokly said, "My parents do not take care of me. I was always with my grandmother. I and Samsung always walk around picking up scraps and trash to eat".



Phearum and Vibo said, "We are from Takeo province. Our mother is blind and our father is dead. We never knew what banknotes or money were. But today we both decided to beg for money at the market."



Thy said, "I have no food, no home and no parental care. I always miss school. My father died of alcoholism. I'm the first to live in Hannah's Hope".





Hann said, "I have a sister living in Hannah's Hope. I have no food to eat. And there is no parental attention either. After my father died, my mother had a new husband."

Hong says, "I do not know my parents. I lived with my grandmother." He added, "I almost never say hello to everyone in Hannah's Hope. Special greetings to the leader (Ravy)."





One day my mother sold me to another family because his mother lost the game when I was 9 years old. Sok Heang cried loudly. HENG



Thai said, "I do not know where my parents are? I had someone pick me up in the field."

COMMENTS FROM RAVY:

The children said that when they lived in Hannah's Hope, it was better than when they lived in their homeland.

They said thank you to God, then thank you to you and me and the staff. They said that if they did not come to live in the organization, they would not know how to live, have food to eat, clothes to wear, shoes or study materials.
