### Frequently Asked Questions about Brad Powers and BP Sports:

Since it is our goal to be the most honest, up front and reputable service on the market today along with being the most accurate, we thought we would take time to answer some FAQ's that we get each year especially for those of you that are new customers.

1. What is your business/handicapping experience level?

I've been betting football and basketball games since the early 1990's. I have a broadcast journalism degree from Bowling Green State University and hosted my own sports talk show in Toledo, Ohio immediately after college. I was a professional handicapper for six years at Northcoast Sports before I stepped away and started my own service in January of 2015. You may have also heard me on Fox Sports Radio's Straight Outta Vegas that airs Monday-Friday from 6-7pm ET and also the Dream Preview Podcast.

2. How is BP Sports different from the other services?

There are probably too many differences to mention in this paragraph and we've addressed many of the differences in the other answers below. We will say generally speaking, we are more conservative meaning fewer star-rated plays and we will offer less packages. It also means we will be far less concerned about the marketing aspect of the industry and will be more about the bottom line, which is to get you as many winners as possible on a consistent basis. College football is our specialty, but we also handicap the NFL, the NBA and college basketball.

3. When will your newsletter get released each week?

It will get emailed to you every Wednesday at Noon ET/9am PT.

4. Why aren't you guys doing a mailed version of your newsletter?

In order for you to receive our newsletter in a timely manner, it would have to be completely written on Sunday and put in the mail first thing Monday morning. Personally, we would like to have the two extra days of gathering key information (reading injury reports, listening to coaches' press conferences, etc) in hopes of picking you more winners. It has worked the last four years as we are easily the No. 1 newsletter combined in college football and the NFL (see page 8)! Also, college football totals lines get released on Tuesdays and we'd like to include one or two of those in every issue (there's a lot value in CFB totals).

### 5. How will you rate your plays in the newsletter & how will they differ from your VIP service?

Our plays will be graded on a  $1-5\star$  scale with a  $1\star$  being the weakest and a  $5\star$  being the strongest. We will not have any  $5\star$  plays in my newsletter (those will only be given out to our VIP service customers). Most of the time, our newsletter plays will be rated from  $1-4\star$ 's. However, we will not have a set number of plays each week. We could have two  $4\star$ 's one week and none the next. It all depends on whether or not we see any value in that particular week. Generally speaking, we will have 4-5 college plays each week and 2-3 NFL plays each week. Obviously, star-rated VIP plays are stronger plays. We will also have more star-rated plays for our VIP customers (especially college totals). However, we will never go against a star-rated play in our newsletter.

6. Do I get any FREE bonuses for being a Powers' Picks subscriber?

We'll be perfectly frank here. If you're the type of customer that gets "suckered" in with a bunch of FREE bonuses like a 5★ play, a \$50 debit card, two weeks of NFL preseason, etc then we don't think we're the service for you. Your bonus with us is getting our services and newsletter discounted to some of the lowest prices on the market today (see page 5). You also get rare late week updates if there is late-breaking news on a star-rated play in the newsletter that severely affects the play (QB injured, weather, etc). With that being said, we do give out our Thanksgiving weekend VIP service for FREE at the end of November for any newsletter subscriber.

7. Will you include your projected scores on all games in your newsletter?

Yes. Download last year's issues of Powers' Picks at bradpowerssports.com to get an idea of how our weekly write-ups will look. We will include a projected score on each game **including all mid-week games!** Obviously, the bigger the disparity between our projections and the actual line (both side and total) will tell you how strong our lean on the game is.

8. Will you have a FREE comp line with daily picks during football season?

No. We think it is in our best interest to protect our "paying" customers. However, we will have FREE picks posted on my website (bradpowerssports.com) each week.

9. Will you have any 5★ plays, Games of the Month, Games of the Year?

Yes. We will have big plays, but unlike most services on the market today, we will not market those plays a full week or two in advance which obviously is a marketing ploy to get you to spend more money. If there's "value" meaning the line is right, the injury report is good, we've loved what we've heard during the week from the coaches/players, we've found a key piece of information (OL banged up, etc) that is getting overlooked by the public, then we'll release that 5★ play (Games of the Month and Game of the Year included) to our VIP customers. However, you won't be hearing us advertise it all week on a FREE comp tape just so we can make a quick \$100 from you on one, single play.

10. Will handicapping basketball get in the way of your football handicapping? No, we are a football first service!!! We will not be spending much time whatsoever on basketball until the college football bowl season is over with in early January. Most of you don't get involved in basketball anyways until March Madness.

11. Why are your prices lower than other services?

First, our prices did go up a little from the last couple of years, but that is because the newsletter was basically given to you at cost. Even with a slight increase, we're still at a minimum 20% lower than any other newsletter out there (currently \$79). We also want as many people on board with us regardless of what your budget is. We're in the business of establishing long-term customers and giving out a good first impression. Second, we think many services are over-priced and it really effects your year-end profit. We want to make you as much money as possible and if that's the case, our own profits will take care of themselves.

12. Do you lean with more favorites or dogs? Overs or Unders?

We don't have a particular preference other than finding "value" and finding "winners" for our customers. However, we will say we are "contrarian" handicappers so therefore we do have more underdogs and "UNDER" plays on our cards than most fly-by-night services. Let's face it, the public tends to lean with favorites and the "OVER" and there's a reason the Vegas sportsbooks haven't had a single losing month in 6 years!

13. Do you recommend getting other services?

Depending on your budget, yes! We're a firm believer in that you can never have enough information at your fingertips and it's damn near impossible in today's day and age for one person or one service to have all of the answers and information. There are plenty of great services out there like Marc Lawrence's Playbook, the Gold Sheet, Power Sweep and Power Plays, etc that you should subscribe to in addition to our Powers' Picks newsletter. What you need to be careful of is signing up for too many late phone services that sometimes can cost you thousands of dollars and that could really effect your year-end profits and bankroll. So as long as you budget accordingly, we think having multiple newsletters is not a bad thing and we personally try to subscribe to all of the major newsletters.

14. Can I buy individual plays from you?

Yes. This year you can buy individual plays, weeks and months from us. We will be doing a little more in-season marketing than the last couple of years as it has been almost non-existent. However, keep in mind, anything can happen in one single game or one single week of action. **Gambling is a marathon not a sprint.** We'd prefer you to sign up for our newsletter for the entire year or sign up for an entire year of our VIP service instead of picking and choosing certain plays and weeks to play on and pass on. That's how you can get really behind in this business.

15. Why did you move to Las Vegas?

We firmly believe that with sports gambling becoming more popular and relevant with each passing year, you have to understand the betting markets that much more and not just solely rely on your "gut instinct" when it comes to games/plays. We feel that weekly interactions with sports book directors and some of the best handicappers in the world will hopefully continue to give us an added edge over the competition.

Another reason for the move was the BP Sports branding factor. While you are now familiar with the service and we continue to add new customers every week, the reality is we want to be the biggest, the most profitable and the most recognizable service in the industry while also maintaining that "mom-and-pop" store feel when it comes to customer service. Similar to a stock broker or real estate mogul wanting to be the best in their industry, therefore they would head to New York; In this industry, if you want to be the best, you head to Las Vegas and that's where we are!

### 16. What are your expectations for this year and what is a successful season?

Obviously, every play we release both in my newsletter and for our VIP customers, we fully expect to win going into that game. However, while winning every game and hitting as close to 100% as possible is everyone's goal, it's just not reasonable in this industry to hit 80-90% winners on a consistent basis. Unlike what many services market to their customers, there are no "sure things" and "guaranteed" locks in this business and you'll never hear us advertise that way. Counting juice, about 52.38% winners are needed to break even. If you count in the money you paid for a particular handicapping service, then you probably need to hit closer to 55% mark to break even. It's when you get to that 57% mark on a consistent basis is where if you manage your money accordingly, you get solid profits. Obviously anything above 57% is icing on the cake.

### 17. Why should I pick your service?

Like we mentioned earlier, there are a lot of great services out there that are worth a look. However, when your life and future continues to be on the line, you better win. When you bet your own games like we do (many handicappers don't bet their own plays), you better win. Quite frankly, we don't handicap with monopoly money like other services! That's why we're the only newsletter that posts betting tickets. When you can't afford to rest on past laurels and successes from seasons in the 1980s and 1990s, you better win. Finally, when you want to make a good impression and gain a long-term customer, you better win! Clearly winning cures everything and losing is not an option for us in any year!!

### NFL Preseason Records 2015-2018

Below is a chart of each NFL team's preseason record since 2015. Your average bettor might find it hard to find anything worth "betting into" as preseason results from year-to-year quite often change due in large part to coaching turnover.

However, if one dives into QB rotations, overall depth of a team, coaches' press conferences, ATS trends, etc, one can find some value in the NFL preseason.

A couple of great examples in finding value in the NFL preseason have come in the last 5-10 years. First, the Colts were historically poor performers during the Peyton Manning era going 5-25 SU and 9-20-1 ATS from 2005-11. On the flip side, the Seahawks under Pete Carroll were 21-7 SU/22-6 ATS in the preseason from 2011-2017.

In terms of current trends, Baltimore's John Harbaugh doesn't mess around with a 18-3 SU, 17-4 ATS record the last five seasons while the Raiders are just 8-16 SU/7-17 ATS the last six seasons.

Arguably one of the most intriguing preseason trends is evaluating first-year head coaches. Some feel that new coaches will have a desire to play well and get off to a good start. But recent results say it's been a net neutral. Teams with a first-year HCs went 14-10 SU/11-13 ATS in 2015, 14-14 SU/13-15 ATS in 2016, 12-12 SU/12-9-3 ATS in 2017 and 14-15 SU/16-13 ATS. You got a ton of them this year with Arizona, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Denver, Green Bay, Miami and the N.Y. Jets all with new head coaches. However, Bruce Arians does have preseason experience at his other head coaching stops (see right).

### **Hall of Fame Game Write-Up:**

Denver 17 Atlanta 14. Expect there to be quite a few Denver fans with the induction of long-time Denver CB Champ Bailey and former long-time Broncos owner Pat Bowlen who recently died. Neither franchise has played here recently as the Broncos last trip here came back in 2004 while the Falcons haven't been here since 1994. Vic Fangio takes over as head coach in Denver while Atlanta head coach Dan Quinn has not put much stock into the preseason the last couple of years going 0-8 SU/ATS. His offense only scored a combined 27 points in four preseason games last year. The Falcons have the superior QB rotation here with Matt Schaub as a back-up to Matt Ryan while Joe Flacco will sit out tonight for the Broncos. ## Top 5 NFL Season Win Total/Division Bets 1. Pittsburgh to win AFC North (+175 at CG Technology)

We're not sold on the Browns who haven't won a division title since 1989. We feel Baltimore might take a step back this year with teams having a full year to dissect QB Lamar Jackson's tape and the Bengals are now dealing with an injury to WR AJ Green to start the season. That leaves us with the Steelers who should be plenty motivated after missing out on the playoffs a year ago. There's been less off-field distractions for them in any off-season in at least 5 years and they've been at their best in the underdog role since (52-31-4 ATS 63%).

2. Arizona Cardinals UNDER 5.5 Wins I-120 at Caesar's

We're not buying an historically small (by NFL standards) rookie QB in Kyler Murray paired with a new head coach in Kliff Kingsbury that was a failure in college. When you take out games against lowly Kansas, Kingsbury was a miserable 13-35 in Big 12 play. If he couldn't cut it vs college coaches, we don't expect him to have much success here. Also note that in the current full season lines at CG Technology, Arizona is an underdog in all 16 games! They could pull 5 upsets and we'd still cash our ticket here.

3. Cleveland Browns UNDER 9 Wins (+115 at CG Technology)

We are contrarian NFL handicappers and we have no problem fading one of the most talked about teams in the NFL this off-season. The Browns certainly have a lot of weapons at the skill positions, but they have a rookie head coach in Freddie Kitchens that has to deal with a lot of combustible personalities. They're also dealing with a lot of expectations for the first time in a long time as the Browns haven't won a division title since 1989. With a below average offensive line and a sneaky tough schedule early on that features home games against the Rams and Seahawks and road games at Baltimore, at San Francisco and at New England, we think Cleveland could get off to a slow start.

4. Oakland Raiders UNDER 6 Wins (-105 at Caesar's)

The Raiders are dealing with a lot of distractions with the "Hard Knocks" TV show this pre-season and the impending move to Las Vegas next year. Then snow this pre-season and the impending move to Las Vegas next year. Then coincide that with arguably one of the toughest schedules in the NFL. From September 16 to November 2nd, the Raiders don't play a single home game and those road trips come against playoff caliber teams like Minnesota, Indianapolis, Chicago, Green Bay and Houston. Overall, the Raiders travel 32,023 miles in 2019 (only team in the NFL this year that will travel more than 30,000 miles).

5. New Orleans Saints UNDER 10.5 Wins 1-130 at Golden Nugget)

We still don't think the Saints are over the devastating loss to the Rams in the NFC Championship game and they've been notorious slow starters the last 5 years (1-9 SU/ATS in their first two games of the season). Drew Brees took a nose dive at the end of last season. After having 7 games (in the first 10) with at least an 89.0 QBR, he didn't top 85.4 in any of his final 7 starts. Now at age 40, can we count on him to play like he has throughout his career? Also in NFC South action, we think Carolina, Atlanta and Tampa Bay will all be improved this year. Someone has to take a step back and we think it will be the Saints.

### **Week 1 Examples Only at Current Lines!!!** 3★ Rutgers -12 over Massachusetts, now -14.5!!!

After 11 straight losses to close the 2018 season, Rutgers needs a "feel-good" win to start off 2019. The Scarlet Knights hammered Texas St 35-7 as a 16.5-point favorite in last year's opener and 1 expect more of the same here. Also note in their only other big favorite role in the last two years, Rutgers beat Morgan St 65-0 (-41) so head coach Chris Ash is certainly not afraid to run it up. This should be a much improved Rutgers offense with 8 starters back. On the other side, UMass is the least experienced team in the entire country (No. 130 in Phil Steelee)'s experience chart) with only 8 returning starters. It's clearly a rebuilding year under new head coach Walt Bell. The Minutemen lose their top 2 passers, their top 3 rushers and an All-American at WR in Andy Isabella who led the country with 1,698 receiving yards last year (Drafted in 2nd round). On defense they lose their top player in Bryton Barr who had 147 tackles a year ago. I have this line at Rutgers -17.

\*\*USC needs a feel-good win here after a disappointing 2018 season. Head coach Clay Helton is clearly on the hot seat but he did make a great hire in bringing in O.C. Graham Harrell from North Texas whose offenses averaged 35 ppg the last two years. Harrell inherits a lot of talent as QB JT Daniels is back after starting as a true freshman last year along with one of the best sets of WR's in the country (top 3 return). Meanwhile, Fresno St is being over-priced because the Bulldogs are coming off their best season in school history (12 wins). I look for the Bulldogs to take a couple steps back this season as they are No. 129 in the country in returning experience (both in Bill Connelly's returning production and Phil Steele's experience chart) with only 9 starters back. Fresno will be starting a brand new QB at night in a freshly renovated L.A. Coliseum. I have this line power-rated at USC -13.

2 Missouri - 14 over Wyoming now - 14.5!!

Missouri hammered Wyoming last year 40-13 (-19.5) as the Tigers had a massive 601-248 yard edge. The Tigers have been great "bullies" under head coach Barry Odom as they are 11-0 SU/9-2 ATS laying double-digits with an average cover of 13.8 ppg! The average score in those games is 55-18 so obviously Odom isn't afraid to run it up. Yes, the Tigers have to replace QB Drew Lock, but his replacement is Clemson transfer Kelly Bryant who should be plenty motivated here. He is surrounded by plenty of talent led by RB Larry Rountree (1,216 yards rushing last year). On the other side, Wyoming has to replace a fot of their best players including RB Nico Evans (1,325 yards rushing last year), their top 2 receivers and 3 of their best defenders. I have this line power-rated at Missouri -18.

### **1★** Michigan -30.5 over Middle Tennessee, now -32!!

I usually don't like playing on huge favorites but I think this line should have Michigan laying 35. The Wolverines return 8 starters on offense and are moving to a more up-tempo style under new O.C. Josh Gattis. That has me hopeful they won't be as conservative as in years past. On the other side, the Wolverine defense should be plenty motivated after allowing 103 points in the last two games of 2018. Remember they only allowed only 13.5 ppg in the first 11 games of the season. Meanwhile, Middle Tennessee is one of the least experienced teams in the country (No. 122 in Bill Connelly's returning production and No. 114 in Phil Steele's experience chart). They lose a 4-year starting QB in Brent Stockstill who was the school's all-time leading passer (12,495 career passing yards) and they will be starting a brand new QB on the road in a rare night game in Ann Arbor.
