All Lakewood Forest residents should have received their annual billing statement from the Lakewood Forest Fund ("the HOA"). In past years, this invoice included an optional line item for residents to join the Lakewood Forest Civic Association (LFCA), at an annual cost of \$10. For the year 2020, the line item to join the LFCA is not included in the HOA's billing statement. The entire fee due (\$630) is only for mandatory HOA dues.

Payment to and membership in the LFCA has always been and continues to be completely voluntary. However, we have had a very large percentage of our residents join the LFCA and we thank you for your support over the years.

The Lakewood Forest Civic Association is an independent, non-profit neighborhood association incorporated in 1985 to promote the general welfare of Lakewood Forest residents and to support civic betterment for Lakewood Forest and surrounding areas. 

Each year the Lakewood Forest Civic Association makes a donation to the six elementary and middle schools attended by children living in Lakewood Forest. 

They did a fabulous job with fall decorations and delicious refreshments. The hostess table was graced by a beautiful fall arrangement created by Barbara Crum.





The program was entitled "Horticulture Tips from Lakewood Forest Garden Club Experts" featuring leader Becky Bailey, Bette Gerhold and Eleese Lester-Baier.

Becky introduced us to the native poinsettia and the American beauty berry. Both plants are easy to grow and can spring up everywhere.

Bette shared her success of propagating a "cowardly lion" begonia by first rooting a cutting in water and transplanting it into fresh soil after 6 weeks when the root system was well established.

Eleese introduced us to the moringa and purslane plant. Both have been used in cooking and as medicinals. She recommends serving the small, tender leaves in salads.


The panel also answered questions from the membership. We learned that it is difficult to eradicate mimosa trees as they spread roots that might damage structures. Members shared tips about fertilizers for flower beds as well as lawns and agreed that organic fertilizers and composts are best for plants and the environment.



Door Prize - A beautiful flower arrangement designed by Marilyn Bullen from her garden graced the President's table and then went to door prize winner Sue Collins.







Gardening Hints From the Pro, Sherri



December To-Do List

In the Flowerbeds

Deadhead and feed cool season color plants with Color Star Fertilizer. Continue to plant cool weather color: pansies, snapdragons, cabbage, kale, viola, alyssum, lobelia, cyclamen, and much more...

In the Lawns

Your lawn should be in a dormant state and there's not much to do at this point. Make sure to back off your water while the lawn is dormant but make sure to water if we are going to have freezing temperatures.

Poinsettias

Water well until soil is saturated and allow to dry between watering. Apply water to soil and not the foliage or blooms. Keep away from drafts.

Feed the Birds!

Don't forget to keep seed feeders full and fresh water in bird baths. Put out suet cakes. The extra protein helps keep our feathered friends warm in the winter months.

Freezes

Have frost cloth on hand to cover tender plants in case of freezing weather. Wrap plants completely down to ground level. The fewer cold drafts that move under the frost cloth, the better.

In the Vegetable Garden

Work compost into the top couple of inches of your garden beds. Plant a cover crop in empty beds such as peas, oats, or rye to keep the soil active. These cover crops can be cut and worked into the soil before spring planting. You can still plant cool weather seeds about every 2 weeks for fresh veggies into spring.

We are still recommending that you do soil remediation after the past two very wet years. The first step will be applying MicroLife Humates Plus. This is loaded with beneficial microbes that will repair your soils and help with long term recovery. Second, you will want to apply Medina soil activator and liquid molasses to stimulate microbial activity.

It is time to apply rye seed for a green lawn all winter. If you go with the rye seed, make sure it's an annual turf type rye. Regular Gulf type rye gets tall and is better for grazing animals than growing as a lawn.

Telge Road Detention Basin Becomes Dragonfly Habitat – Restoration and Conservation Combine

On a sunny day, anyone who visits a fresh body of water can find dragonflies darting about as they feast on insects. What is less obvious is that dragonflies successfully capture their prey 95% of the time. This research, published in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences* in 2012, revealed dragonflies are among the most efficient and lethal predators on Earth.

Dragonflies and damselflies belong to the scientific order Odonata, or "toothed one" as it's translated in Greek, which refers to their serrated teeth.

These aquatic invertebrates are fascinating for many reasons, but the most important is their unspoken agreement with people to hunt pest mosquitoes. "The enemy of my enemy is my friend" is an ancient proverb that holds true to the relationship we have with dragonflies.

A single dragonfly can consume hundreds of mosquitoes per day. An ally like that is worth keeping around, which is exactly what Commissioner R. Jack Cagle had in mind when he suggested turning a run-of-the-mill detention basin into a dragonfly habitat.

"We transformed an ugly stormwater drainage hole in the ground into a place where our beautiful but voracious winged friends can thrive and entertain us," Cagle said.

Anita Schiller, director of Precinct 4's Biological Control Initiative, was asked to consult on the basin design to ensure beneficial wildlife, such as dragonflies and damselflies, would be incorporated. Additionally, Schiller was tasked with introducing native, non-game fish species and native, aquatic carnivorous plants to keep the basin from becoming a mosquito breeding ground. Schiller and her team released native dragonfly and damselfly nymphs at the basin since they not only feed on mosquitoes in the adult stage of life, but they are also relentless mosquito predators in the larval stage. Additionally, Schiller introduced carnivorous bladderwort plants to serve as natural barriers to discourage mosquito breeding in the basin.

Another motivation to create a dragonfly habitat at the Telge Road Detention Basin was preservation of these beneficial allies. There are 90 distinct species of Odonata in Harris County and more than 5,000 worldwide. But one in six species in North America are at risk of extinction, including some along the Gulf Coast.

It may be a long time before the stars align again with a site featuring ideal circumstances that achieve so many varying goals at one time. Until then, this project is an example of the success that comes from unique partnerships.


