

Carmen told me about the foundation, "As a Foundation we support conservation, recreation and education in Iowa County. We help with funding for Iowa County Conservation properties and programs and any conservation related needs. All the proceeds from this event go into the Friends account. Lately I have been thinking a lot about how lucky some of us are in Iowa County to have so many natural outdoor areas to enjoy. But not everyone is so lucky. That is one reason I joined the board. We do guite a bit to help with programs that Iowa County Conservation offers for families and children. This includes properties like Lake Iowa, Gateway Park in Marengo and some other nature areas. We provide monetary support for programs that are open to all kids in Iowa County. Including special events, outdoor education through day camps and field trips. There are also events and classes offered to adults in Iowa County also."

"We are looking forward to a fun evening supporting conservation in Iowa County. The Nature Center is a beautiful space that has been recently updated with many new displays. We hope folks will want to come out and enjoy this banquet," she

Lake Iowa Park is indeed an accessible, local natural resource for family fun. It offers 120 camping sites with electricity, shower houses and picnic tables. All site camping is offered first come for serve. Lake lowa is an 83-acre lake with large mouth bass, red ear sunfish, perch and catfish. This is a no wake, no wave lake. "Jon boats" with trolling motors are available for rental by contacting campground hosts or a Lake Iowa Park Ranger. Yes, you can bring own boat with trolling motor, your canoes and kayaks.

There are seven picnic shelters that overlook Lake Iowa. These can be reserved in advance for just \$25. They have grills and restrooms nearby. There is a swimming beach, open sunrise to sunset with a swim at your own risk policy. The beach has a restroom and a water hydrant. Yes there are walking trails.

There are two cabins to rent for your next kids' slumber party or family overnight. Each cabin has a full kitchen and ADA compliant bathroom. Each will sleep 8 people. For more about Lake Iowa go to mycountyparks.com or google Iowa County Lake Iowa.


