April General Meeting



Lisa has the following to say about the program:

"On Wednesday, April 1st, 2015, I will be presenting teaching materials and methods for improvisation and composition. I invite anyone who has questions about Composers Today or the Improvisation Festival to email me ahead of time at lisa.fitchett@gmail.com. In particular, for anyone who has a student who is "stuck" with the beginning of a piece, but doesn't know where to go from there, I invite teachers to send me a PDF of their student's work in progress ASAP, with a brief outline of the student's background (such as how long they've been studying, and what theory level they are comfortable with). Teachers may also email me an MP3, MPEG4, or WAV file (audio recording) of student improvisation if they wish. (Recordings can be made easily using the "voice memo" function of iPhone, and sent directly from there."

In Remembrance



Obituary for Richard Wilmot Earhart

January 19, 1940—February 25, 2015

Richard died with his wife, Louise Hall Earhart at his side. He had suffered for some time from a pernicious neurological disease that progressively robbed him of his vitality. Richard remained alert and courageous to the end.

Richard was the first-born son of Alice and Daniel Earhart of Columbus, Ohio. He graduated from Middlebury College in Vermont, and received a Master of Science in Physics from the Ohio State University. He served in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Germany 1962-1964, returning to the U.S. as a First Lieutenant.

After returning from Germany, Richard worked for the Pentagon for three years and then returned to Ohio, where he worked for a NASA contract research firm -- Battelle Memorial Institute . In Columbus he met the Love of his Life, Louise, who with his support, earned a PhD in music theory.

In 1988, Richard took a job with Rockwell International in Southern California. Louise joined Richard in Long Beach in 1990, where she started a successful teaching career in piano. After leaving Rockwell, Richard discovered his true vocation: personal computers. He established a one-man business, First Class Computer Services—a business that evolved as computers and networking evolved. Starting with keeping “old” systems going beyond their intended life, Richard migrated many of his somewhat reluctant clients over to more serviceable web-capable systems. He was also a principal in GOAL, a venture to build a vertical lift-off plane. Richard will be missed by his many clients, by the computer club with whose members he shared knowledge, and by his colleagues at GOAL.

Richard enjoyed vacationing at his family’s summer cottage on Mullet Lake, Michigan, a place of great times spent with family and friends over most of his life.

In addition to Louise, Richard is survived by his brother James (Donna), his Aunt Lois, and many nephews and nieces.

There will be two celebrations of Richard’s life:


