The Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Illinois 2015 Annual Meeting Minutes

The Annual Meeting of the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Illinois was held on November 21, 2015, at the Glen Club in Glenview. The meeting was called to order by Governor Jane Schleinzer at 11:30 a.m. Jessica Schleinzer gave the invocation, and Brian White led the pledge of allegiance after which the members read the Pilgrim Pledge. Deputy Governor John Schellinger read the Mayflower Compact, and Jane Schleinzer welcomed the members and guests, reminding them that this was the day, 395 years ago, that the Mayflower Compact was signed. Past Governors were introduced and members serving the General Society were acknowledged: Max Brown, Pilgrim Academic Research Committee, Ruth Lucchesi, Technology Committee, Laurie Sutherland, Development Committee and Mayflower Quarterly Editorial Committee and Jane Schleinzer, 2020 Anniversary Committee and Insignia and Sales Committee. Junior members were introduced. Mary Morony read the minutes from the Spring luncheon meeting. Governor Jane Schleinzer outlined the progress of the legislation authorizing a commemorative coin for the Mayflower year 2020 celebration, asking that members solicit support of their congressmen and the two Illinois senators. If 287 members of congress and 67 senators sponsor the bill it will not have to be voted upon.

Other announcements: seeking member email addresses; Illinois Society recognized as being top in Social Media thanks to Newsletter Editor Karen Seda and Webmaster Dorr Lewright; thank-you notes received from national for Illinois Society donations; yearbooks in the mail to all members; members can use Amazon Smile when Christmas shopping to contribute to the society; Governor General's visit scheduled for May 14, 2016; Thanksgiving Pilgrim shows will be aired on PBS and National Geographic channels Thanksgiving week. A member requested a listing of the membership by city/town for potential carpooling to meetings. Membership Secretary Don Sherman reported on the membership is currently: Regular- 266, Life- 757, Jr. Life- 18, Total 1,041. A motion was passed approving two new Junior Associates, Colin and Ethan McLean. Don finished his report with the necrology which included 14 members. At 12:05 pm Jane pointed out that the soon-to-be-record-breaking snowstorm was worsening so in lieu of a Treasurers Report Ruth Lucchesi would be available during the luncheon to answer questions, and Jessica gave the blessing prior to a delicious lunch. As dessert was being served John introduced author Beverly Dawson who traced the history of the Glenview Naval Air Station from its beginnings in 1929 as Curtis Aviation through its closing up to the present day. Max Brown explained the procedure for the Mayflower Ancestor Family Photo session to be held at the close of the meeting. Junior Members Committee Chair Jessica Schleinzer reported she is sending birthday books for Juniors ages 5-18 and so needs a complete list of Juniors' addresses. She outlined the upcoming food bank visit and food drive to be held at the May meeting.

New members to the Illinois Society were asked to come forward for an installation ceremony performed by Governor Jane Schleinzer, Past Governor Max Brown and Ruth Lucchesi.

There being no further business, Jessica Schleinzer gave the benediction, and the meeting was adjourned at 1:40 p.m.


The Witches: Salem, 1692

As a feature of the 2014 General Society Congress in Plymouth, we had a trip up the Massachusetts coast with a stop in Salem, including a tour of the House of Seven Gables and the once-world-famous Salem Harbor. And as do many of us, I have a good friend who descends from one of the Salem witches, Susannah Martin. Thus when the Pulitzer Prizewinning author Stacy Schiff wrote The Witches/Salem, 1692, I was at least interested enough to cart the book home from my local library branch.

Did I like the book? Not much. There really is too much material when you count all the witches, all the judges, all the ministers, not to mention the long-suffering adolescent accusers. A spread sheet might work, but, remember, this is a non-fiction book we're talking about. On the other hand, every time I got to the point where I was ready to tote it back to its rightful owner, up would pop some true gem of fascinating history: Did you know most of those bewitched girls were orphaned and/or captured during the Indian wars and thus housed as virtual servants? And did you know that family feuds and fights over inheritances were great motivators for witch informants? Then there was the issue of the New Englanders' fear for their immortal souls. If you had done something that might suggest you were a witch, but you weren't sure you were one, if you confessed to being a witch, your soul was cleansed. Does that sound familiar in this era of suicide bombers?

Ms. Schiff looks at the confounding issue of why those accusing teenaged girls kept dropping to the floor, contorting their limbs, breaking out in pinpricks accompanied by



Another thing I found interesting was the author's conclusion that the Massachusetts establishment had made such a botch of the whole witch hunt episode that later generations opted to consign Cotton Mather, his fellow ministers and all the judges to the historical junk heap and replace them as poster children in the annals of Colonial history with our Pilgrim ancestors all dusted off and looking good.

The Boy Who Fell Off the Mayflower, or John Howland's Good Fortune

By P.J. Lynch. In the first book he has both written and illustrated, master artist P.J. Lynch brings a Mayflower voyager's story to vivid life.

At a young age, John Howland learned what it meant to take advantage of an opportunity. Leaving the docks of London on the Mayflower as an indentured servant to Pilgrim John Carver, John Howland little knew that he was embarking on the adventure of a lifetime. By his great good fortune, John survived falling overboard on the crossing of the

Atlantic Ocean, and he earned his keep ashore by helping to scout a safe harbor and landing site for his bedraggled and ill shipmates. Would his luck continue to hold amid the dangers and adversity of the Pilgrims' lives in New England? John Howland's tale is masterfully told in his own voice, bringing an immediacy and young perspective to the oft-told Pilgrims' story. P.J. Lynch captures this pivotal moment in American history in precise and exquisite detail, from the light on the froth of a breaking wave to the questioning voice of a teen in a new world.

We will also be holding a food drive at the May meeting and these canned food items will be donated to the food bank on July 9th. As in the General Society, the Illinois Society's mission is tied to education. Our first project, enacted in 2010, is our Illinois Society Scholarship. One of the largest scholarships awarded by any state chapter, ours awards \$2500 each year to an Illinois resident, enrolled or accepted in an accredited college or university for any undergraduate year or for graduate education. Preference is given to proven descendants of a Mayflower passenger, but all applicants must be nominated by a member of the Illinois Chapter. The scholarship is awarded based upon academic achievement, extra-curricular activities, community service and financial need.

Members of the Illinois Chapter are invited to support this wonderful and worthwhile project. Any amount they may wish to donate is appreciated, but those contributing \$100 or more asked to make contributions in the name of one of their Mayflower ancestors. Names of persons honored are recorded and maintained on the Illinois Society web site. Two years later we added a second education program, a sponsorship of the Chicago Metro History Fair competition. Readers may or may not be familiar with this program which is similar to the better-known national Science Fair. In this annual competition local students present their own historical research projects. Students not only become historians; they also become better citizen. In conducting research, they extend the walls of the classroom into the community by visiting historical and cultural institutions, sites, and interviewing people who are experts or participants in a historic event. In studying the history of their community, they learn how decisions are made in the social, cultural, economic, and political realms that affect their lives.

Since its founding in 1977, the Chicago Metro History Education Center has earned a nationwide reputation for leadership in the field of history education. In addition to training the students, they have trained several of our members as judges of the competition.

Several Illinois heritage societies had worked with one senior professor of history at Northwestern University who would select outstanding research candidates who he recommended for funding. Unfortunately, but the time our State Society made the decision to fund graduate studies, the gentleman was packing his bags in anticipation of his eminent retirement. And he made it quite clear that there was then nor would there ever again be anyone in any school who could replicate his endeavors! But there was a program that fulfilled our requirements and we found it at the same local institution that specializes in genealogy, the Newberry Library, which provides fellowships to support graduate researchers who wish to use their extensive collections. They promise candidates "intriguing and often rare materials; a lively, interdisciplinary community of researchers; individual consultations on your research with staff curators, librarians, and other scholars; and an array of both scholarly and public programs." Although both long term (4-12 month) and short term (1-2 month) programs are offered, to date we have only sponsored Short-Term Fellowships, which are primarily intended to assist researchers who need to examine specific items in the Newberry's collection.

2020 Commemorative Coin

Just a few short years from now, 2020 will be upon us, marking the 400th anniversary of the voyage of the Mayflower and the founding of Plymouth Colony. This is an exciting opportunity for GSMD to commemorate our Pilgrim ancestors and to share their inspirational story with the world!

To organize commemoration events and initiatives, GSMD has created a planning committee at the national level. Many of our 52 member societies are preparing for the 2020 Commemoration as well. Here, you will find everything you need to know about our plans for 2020 and the plans of our member societies, so check back often for updates. GSMD's first 2020 initiative is to push for the United States Congress to pass an Act directing the US Mint to issue a commemorative coin series recognizing key historical elements surrounding the Mayflower voyage and the establishment of Plymouth colony.
