Town of West Jefferson - Board of Aldermen Special Meeting Minutes March 22, 2022 | 5:30 p.m.

At 5:30 p.m. Mayor Hartman called to order the special meeting of the Board of Aldermen.

Special Session - Discussion of FY 2022-23 Budget.

Discussion of Cost of Living Adjustment for Employees

- January inflation rate 7.9%
- Social Security gave increase 2022 5.9%
- Bring employees making below \$15 up to the \$15/hour

Police Chief Brad discussed a 14% increase to match newer employees' wages to that of neighboring towns. After the discussion the board was in consensus to go with a 13% cost of living adjustment for all employees.

The board was also in consensus to give all employees a \$2000 bonus with ARP funds as previously discussed. Thoughts on giving each employee a \$2,000 bonus with ARP funds – estimated cost \$50,000 with benefits – would still leave \$150,000 for sewer line rehab. County paid \$2,500 to each employee in December 2021.

Review Health Insurance for Retiring Employees -

An overview of health insurance for retirees was discussed. The board requested the Town Manager for additional information.

Each department head went over their budget requests for the upcoming budget year of 2022-23.

<u>Administration</u> - Town Manager Brantley Price reviewed the administrative requests for the budget. Noteworthy items discussed are as follows:
