November Reflection

Philippians 4:10-14 "I rejoice in the Lord greatly that now at last you have revived your concern for me; indeed, you were concerned for me, but had no opportunity to show it. Not that I am referring to being in need; for I have learned to be content with whatever I have. I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need. I can do all things through him who gives me strength. In any case, it was kind of you to share in my distress."

For the past couple of months in Bible Study we have been looking through a few of the minor epistles of Paul. We started in Galatians and we read about Paul's anger with the church, how they were easily letting themselves be deceived. Then we read through Ephesians, and we saw the way that Paul's heart broke as this once proud and united congregation was allowing themselves to be consumed with bitter infighting. Now we are in Philippians, and Paul strikes a decidedly softened tone when speaking to the Philippians. I would encourage you if you haven't read through the letter recently to do so, in it Paul writes some of his most profound theology. Beautiful prose highlight the letter, it even includes a hymn, and whereas in some of his other letters Paul has the tendency to make long rambling arguments he is very concise in this letter to the Philippians.

That is until you get to chapter four verse 10, then Paul starts to ramble. It seems very disjointed when compared to the rest of the letter. Some scholars even suggest that chapter 4:10 was a separate letter entirely addressed to the congregation. So what is it that breaks up the flow of Paul's thoughts, it is his "thank you letter." It seems that Paul for all he was, pastor, evangelist, writer, prisoner, he struggled to express the depth of his thankfulness.

His gratitude to the church in Philippi was almost too great to be encompassed by words, so we have in 4:10 just a long rambling thought that Paul struggles to accurately express. I have to say, I have never felt closer to Paul than I do reading through Philippians 4:10-14.

Maybe it is the season; maybe it is the colder temperatures, maybe it is because it is about to turn November, I'm not sure, but I find myself thinking a lot about thankfulness. I realize that Paul and I have something in common, when you are overcome and overwhelmed with an abundance of thankfulness, it is difficult to put it into words.

I find it difficult to properly express my gratitude to you for letting me be your pastor. I find it difficult to find the words to express just how thankful I am for you, for your heart, and for your willingness to be the hands and feet of Jesus here in Cherryville. This has been a hard year, there isn't anyway around that, indeed

we have faced setbacks and challenges that I dare say none of us had ever prepared for before, and yet time and again First Methodist has risen to the occasion.

I hope we do not take for granted the amazing ways that God is at work in this church and the many ways that the Holy Spirit is equipping us for ministries that we might not have considered years ago. I am so grateful to get to be a part of this special body of Christ. Even if I have rambled a bit, I hope you will excuse me, but I am just so thankful, and maybe just maybe you feel a bit of that thankfulness too. Praise be to God!






