

Tell us about yourself.

I am 45 years old, I was born in Rosita, Mexico. It is a small humble coal mining town in the state of Coahuila. They perform research to find a cure for this type of brain cancer. My family was one of the top 3 fundraising teams last year. Like many of my fellow engineers, I have a series of certifications, experience, and skill set that helps in tackling the day to day challenges that arise in this industry.

How long have you been a member of SAABE?

I have been a member of SAABE for many years. I recently just returned to the industry, as I took some time off to start our small family business (auto sales). One of my first priorities when joining Transwestern in April was my membership to SAABE. I really love the networking opportunities and friends. I'm astounded on the amount of knowledge, experience, and capability that fills the room every month. I have been fortunate to have worked with many of you, it's a great organization I'm proud to be a member.

Family and Children?

I have been married to my wonderful wife for 10 years. We have a blended family, consisting of 6 kids, 3 boys and 3 girls. 5 of our children are in local college and one is a freshman in high school. My wife and older kids manage the business during the day, keeping everyone busy.

What hobbies keep you busy?

Most of my free time is spent with my wife and kids; boating, biking and fishing at the local lakes, still trying to hook that big one. I enjoy just hanging out in the garage at home barbequing and working on things. Currently restoring a '79 Trans-Am (Bandit) and an '88 Fierro GT Fastback. What Advice would you share with those thinking about joining SAABE?

It's a great organization, a must for anyone getting into the industry. I haven't met anyone that is not willing to share their knowledge with one-another.

Be curious and make sure that you like what you are doing. In this industry at first its hard physical, mental work, but it's important to be on top of your organizational skills. My father would always say, "If you love what you're doing, you will never have to worry about money". Also, surround yourself with people who are more experienced than yourself and learn from them. Ask questions, take trade courses, get certification and such, and take advantage of any free classes out there. Finally, don't be afraid to get your hands dirty and take a hands-on approach, you will probably learn more by doing it then reading about it.

How did you get into the trade/Industry?

I have been fortune to always been mechanically inclined and good with my hands, for whatever reason, starting with welding and cutting at age 13 and working on tractors. In 1989, at age 17, I started working at a hotel called La Mansion Del Rio. It was a part time job, while still in high school. I began as a "gopher", with the maintenance guys. The director of Engineer Dept., Gary, an ex-Naval Officer, told me that I should look into making a career of it, because he saw potential in me, because I loved the type of work I was doing. So after much schooling from TEEX to boiler schools in Houston, and a short 28 years later, I'm proud to be working with some of the best engineers in the city.



VERY IMPORTANT POLICY CHANGE

Due to rising costs in the industry, SAABE will be implementing a new policy. There has been a recurring theme of Regular members RSVPing to the luncheons and then not attending. When you RSVP, we have provide a headcount to the venue and when you don't show, SAABE still has to pay for your plate. On average, we spend \$300 or more on lunches each month for members that were not present. Due to this, beginning in January 2018, we will begin charging our Regular members for recurring noshows to the luncheons. We hate to put this policy in place and have avoided it for many years, but this is a cost that SAABE can't continue to absorb and our options are to drastically raise annual dues, or implement a policy that charges per occurrence.
