# I. MEETING CALLED TO ORDER:

Mayor Douglas called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilmember Forester gave the invocation.

#### IV. CITIZEN-VISITOR COMMENTS:

Randy Johnson gave a brief update of progress on the Water Treatment Plant.

Jon Francis addressed the Council regarding the Village at Cisco saying that the projected cost is misleading because it represents only the shell of the building. He encouraged the Council to find out more information on final costs before taking a vote. He further stated he felt the citizens had spoken resoundingly in favor of petitioning the city to reduce funds to the CDC and C4ADC in favor of creating a Street Maintenance Tax and implored the Council to place the proposition on the ballot.

# VI. CITY LAKES AND RESERVOIRS ORDINANCE WORKSHOP.

Councilmember Campbell began discussion saying that he felt the only change necessary would be to limit the length of boat dock by non-leaseholders to 60 feet from the water's edge including the walkway for those docks on the South Shore only.

Councilmember Weger suggested repealing the sections pertaining to the Recreation Permits, saying that the city hadn't enforced the regulation in years and when it was enforced, it was a money losing venture.

# A. Consider and Discuss Taking Bids on City Owned Property Located at 218 W. 8th Street.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, APPROVING A TYPE B ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROJECT AND AGREEMENT, FOR THE CISCO DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO PROVIDE AND EXPEND FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$557,000.00 FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES, AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO SECTION 505.158 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.

# E. Consider and Discuss Presentation, Public Comments, and Submission of the Eastland County Multi-Jurisdictional FEMA Hazard Mitigation Action Plan to TDEM and FEMA.

The City Secretary indicated that no public comments had been received.

#### F. Consider and Discuss Applying for a Parks & Recreation Grant.

Mr. Archer presented the Council with an opportunity to apply for a grant through the Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife to improve a city park. The grant would require matching funds of 50%. Mayor Douglas reiterated that this item would be only to allow the city to move forward with the application process and would not commit the city to expending any funds at this time.

# G. Consider and Discuss City Secretary's Certification of Petition Filed February 12, 2019.

Mayor Douglas explained that the City Secretary received the petition on February 12, 2019 and she had conducted signature verification concluding that the petition contained the specified number of signatures and the proper affidavit attached.

# H. Consider and Discuss Petition Filed February 12, 2019.

Mayor Douglas read the petition requesting a reduction of sales tax funds to the CDC and C4ADC and creating a Street Maintenance Tax and explained the options for accepting or rejecting the petition. The Council discussed the timing of the petition submission and why the petition could not be placed on the May General Election ballot. The City Secretary explained that the Election Code states that an election must be called during a specific period prior to Election Day and the deadline to call that election was February 15, 2019.

Motion was made by Councilmember C. Johnson to direct the City Secretary to establish proper ballot language and place the petition proposition on the next uniform election date of November 5, 2019, second was made by Councilmember W. Johnson. Motion prevailed by the following vote:

Mr. Diers explained that if the measure on the ballot was passed and the CDC and C4ADC was defunded, the city would maintain control of all assets owned by the two corporations so he feels that it would not affect the project. Councilmember C. Johnson expressed concern over voting to move the project forward until the outcome of the election is known.

Motion was made by Councilmember C. Johnson to table the resolution until election results are certified. Motion died for lack of a second.
