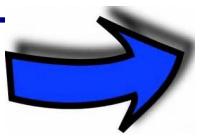

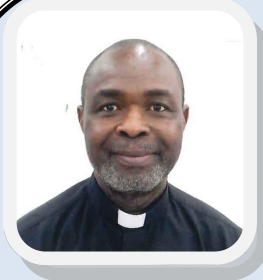


HEADS UP -- MONTHLY YOUTH NIGHTS AHEAD!

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Freedom and Responsibility

Every act directly willed is imputable to its author: Thus the Lord asked Eve after the sin in the garden: "What is this that you have done?" He asked Cain the same question. The prophet Nathan questioned David in the same way after he committed adultery with the wife of Uriah and had him murdered.

An action can be indirectly voluntary when it results from negligence regarding something one should have done: for example, an accident arising from ignorance of traffic laws.

An effect can be tolerated without being willed by its agent; for instance, a mother's exhaustion from tending her sick child. A bad effect is not imputable if it is was not willed either as an end or as a means of an action, e.g., a death a person incurs in aiding someone in danger. For a bad effect to be imputable it must be foreseeable and must have the possibility of avoiding it, as in the case of manslaughter caused by a drunken driver.

Freedom is exercised in relationships between human beings. Every human person, created in the image of God, has the natural right to be recognized as a free and responsible being. All owe to each other this duty of respect. The right to the exercise of freedom, especially in oral and religious matters, is an inalienable requirement of the dignity of the human person. This right must be recognized and protected by civil authority within the limits of the common good and public order.

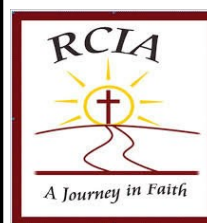

ST. PEREGRINE MASS

Mass in honor of St. Peregrine will be celebrated on Wednesday, July 25, at 6:30 pm. All are most welcome to attend.

St. Peregrine, lived in the thirteenth century and following the instructions of the Virgin Mary received in a vision, joined the Servites Order. When he was afflicted with cancer of the foot and amputation had been decided upon, he spent the night before the operation, in prayer. The following morning he was completely cured. This miracle caused his reputation to become widespread. St. Peregrine, like St. Paul, was in open defiance of the Church as a youth. Once given the grace of conversion he became one of the great saints of his time. His great fervor and qualities as a confessor brought many back to the true Faith. Afflicted with cancer, Peregrine turned to God and was richly rewarded for his faith, enabling him over many years to lead others to the truth. His sanctity of life did much towards increasing the repute of the Servite Order. He is the patron of cancer patients.

FYI The Servite Order is one of the five original Catholic mendicant orders. Its objectives are the sanctification of its members, preaching the Gospel, and the propagation of devotion to the Mother of God, with special reference to her sorrows. Adoption of Mary's virtues of hospitality and compassion are the order's hallmarks. The distinctive spirit of the order is the sanctification of its members by meditation on the Passion of Jesus and the Sorrows of Mary, and spreading abroad this devotion.
