HOLIDAY SAFETY

As you drive through our neighborhood, please bear in mind that the speed limit is **25 MPH**, even on the boulevard. And don't forget to obey the **STOP** sign at the end of the boulevard when entering the subdivision. Our neighborhood has numerous turns, curves and steep hills that require considerable braking at legal speed. Going any faster is not necessary. Let's not have a tragedy ruin the holiday season or any other time.

For the safety of our homeowners, children, and holiday visitors, please drive the legal and safe speed limit throughout the neighborhood, and please do not tailgate drivers who are keeping to the legal and safe speed limit. Please Slow Down! Please Drive Carefully! Reminder, driving while drinking, even if not intoxicated, could lead to some serious legal ramifications. Please give a heads up to your guest coming to or leaving the neighborhood.

Unfortunately tis the season to also have increase awareness about personal, auto, and home security. Keep your doors, outside-parked vehicles locked, and unattended garage doors lowered. Don't forget to remind guests of this. Don't tempt fate by leaving valuable items (e.g. cell phones, GPS devices, iPods, or weapons) in vehicles parked outside. Also, don't display Christmas gifts where they can be seen through front windows and doors. If you are going out of town for an extended period of time, please ask your neighbors to keep an eye out on your house. Collect your mail, pick up things left on your porch – anything that will give an impression that someone is still home. If you witness suspicious activity, please make note of people and vehicle descriptions, tag numbers and report it to the city police. Something that would make a great present this year is a home security camera or system, especially one that you can monitor or alert you while you are away from home.
