

BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. ARTICLE VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Creation and Formation.

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation.

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.
- Washing of Feet.
- Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.
- Do not condone divorce and remarriage.
- Destruction of the Wicked
- Conditional Immortality.
- Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

Final Concert Ordination / Dedication Service

Brother Jack Cornell was the commencement speaker. He was walking in the footsteps of his Father since it was exactly 50 years ago his Father was the commencement speaker. He opened with prayer. He declared that over forty-one years ago he stood where these students were and that anyone who knew him, knew it was a miracle for him to be a minister. As a child in school he was bashful and could not even speak in front of his classmates. On February 19, 1957 he stood behind the sacred desk and preached for the first time under the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

He began his remarks by telling us there was a big job for us to do. His three point sermon stated that to perform the job required, we must be filled with compassion, we must have a commission and we must communicate the God given call. He read in Matthew chapter 9 verse 36 how Jesus was moved with compassion toward the multitudes. He instructed us on how we too must be filled with compassion for those around us.

Brother Jack read in Mark chapter 16 how we have a commission to go out and tell others about God's love. He shared the advice from an elder to him many years ago that if we can be happy doing anything else besides preaching, then we are not called. He shared with us how on a few occasions he felt he could be happy doing another line of work, but then something would happen and he realized he could never be satisfied without the ministry.

Brother Cornell told us we must communicate the call on our lives to others. He gave several definitions for the word communicate, but the one he liked the best was; communicate - the means to be connected. Years ago a minister told him that 90% of his ministry would be outside the pulpit. He emphasized the need to be connected with those in your community. He assured us that God would bless our ministry if we were filled with compassion, answered the commission and communicated that commission to those around us.

At the conclusion of Brother Cornell's remarks the order of service changed again. This time Brother Howard Whiteley, the Head of Academics, stood at the microphone to announce the names of those receiving certificates and diplomas while Brother Grimmer congratulated the students. Those receiving a *Certificate of Semester Completion* were as follows: Calvin Barber, Troy Foster, Greg Goering, Nelda Hendrix, Jennifer Higley, Sara Jennings, Stephen Jennings, Junior Longoria, Duronda Manning, Deryl Sanders, Jeri Sanders and J.R.Slater. Two special awards were given out. The first award was a scholarship presented to Sabrina Wheeler from the *AFBC Scholarship Fund*. It was the first to be awarded and presented by Brother Randell Bensch, the founder, for \$200 each year that she is enrolled in college as a full time student.

The second award was a one-of-a-kind, hand-made violin, a bow and a new case. The violin was made by a Master Craftsman, Rev. Joe Faries. He presented it to the tear-filled graduate, Christina Hawley. After the service Brother Faries told Christina she needed to insure the instrument for not less than \$2,000. We are deeply indebted to Brother Faries for his exceptional gift of love.

Brother Clanton closed by praying over the students. Sister JoAnn Cooper played as the students marched out, followed by the faculty and Board of Directors.

AFBC Annual Business Meeting

Chairman Bill Watson opened the meeting with prayer. He asked the Superintendent to give his report.

The report covered the following topics: faculty (evaluations, pay scale, workers compensation insurance, the returning staff and the need for cooks), students (church work, youth camp teams, potential first year students and potential second year students), property (value appraisals, property work done, insurance coverage and restoration project - phase one), transportation (insurance coverage, bus use policy and bus repair), school (Spring '98 and Fall '99 calendar, promotional efforts, results of recent board elections) and financial (faculty fund, general fund, savings, restoration project, miniature project, scholarship fund, choir tours, Apostolic Faith Report's new computer).

The spreadsheet showed a net income of \$209,000, total expense of \$181,000 and a surplus of \$28,000. The unusual amount of income is partially due to the sale of the Neosho Apostolic Faith Church for \$30,0000, the gift of \$10,000 from the Ronald Shorb Estate and the contribution of \$21,000 for the restoration fund. The unusually high expenses were due in part because of the purchase of another bus for \$14,000 and the restoration project - phase one for \$26,000.

CUBA

New Testament Project

Island Missions and several other ministries have pooled their resources to order 100,000 Spanish New Testaments. These will be ready for distribution this summer. Because of the generous donation of our supporters, Island Missions was able to fund 14,000 of these New Testaments. Three of the other ministries involved also plan to distribute their portion of these New Testaments in Cuba.

Humanitarian Aid

Bob and Lawriece were able to take several hundred pounds of medicine and eyeglasses to the children's hospital and the leper colony. The Lord blessed with free shipping by the airlines.

Support for our leprosy outreach continues to come in. During Bob and Lawriece's recent trip, doctors at the leper colony in Havana requested a specific medicine. Our first shipment of this medicine left the warehouse on Friday, April 24.

The doctors also provided us with a list of laboratory equipment that they need. These items are now on order.

Bible School

The POWER and LIGHT School of Evangelism, established by Carol Granderson, continues to train Cuban ministers. Even though satan has tried using persecution to shut the school down, a remodeling project is under way to enlarge the facilities. Several students have been turned away in the past due to lack of room.

This years graduation ceremony was delayed due to the Pope's visit to Cuba. Carol, Bob and other members of the school's directors could not obtain visas or hotel rooms because of all the reporters flooding in to cover the Pope's visit.

Jesus Film

The Cuban Jesus Film ministry continues to send a monthly report. Twenty-two people were saved during the month of February. This is excellent considering they can't set up in public and draw large crowds like film teams do in non-communist countries.

ISLAND MISSIONS:

LIBERIA

An Open Door

The Lord has opened a door for Island Missions to minister in Monrovia, the capital city of Liberia, West Africa. Bob and Lawriece have been asked to spend 4 to 6 weeks there to equip and train a Jesus Film team (or teams). They left on May 2nd.

This field is ripe for harvest. We are expecting this effort to result in over 100,000 people being saved in this nation of 2.6 million.

Bob requests a lot of earnest prayer for this trip. Liberia has just come out of a long and bloody civil war. Reports are mixed as to how orderly thing are at this time. Electric and telephone systems were completely destroyed by the war.

Jesus Film Equipment

A 3/4 ton, 1988 van was donated by Greater Ministries International for this project. The van was shipped on April 17 along with a generator, a projector, a screen, the Jesus Film and several Bible related movies. The shipping charges were \$2,400.

The generator, shipping charges and airfare were also donated.

Bob and Lawriece had to pay for the projection equipment, movies and other necessary items. Pray that this need will also be met.



This will also be used for teaching children about God. Students trained to use these items should be a blessing to our churches as they graduate from AFBC.

This location is only temporary as it is not nearly large enough to house this collection and then use it with children. Mrs. Lopez's desire is to see it used before her death. We feel very fortunate to have this wonderful gift. Bro. Dennie Oakes asked me to draw up some plans which would also house the Archives Department of the Apostolic Faith Movement.

The plan included with this article was drawn by Lynn and Ute Whiteley after receiving my sketch. This building will be something the movement can be proud of ... and will be a place where children can hear about God. Mrs. Lopez gave us the bleachers she had used, so seating will already be in place when our building is finished.

We ask that you pray with us that God will send in the funds for this project. As a school we will use it to train students to teach children by using children's clubs. It, also, is something to inspire people to do more for their own Sunday School classes. We would also like to make it available to schools, home schoolers and other churches for field trips. We feel that it would be a wonderful outreach ministry for AFBC. The sound most often heard when I opened the doors was the sharp intake of breath as their eyes fell on colorful Bible scenes all around the walls.

In sending your offerings, please make them for :Bible Miniatures" and they will be placed in a savings account until such time that we can begin building. Most of all ... PRAY ... and God will see that the building is completed.


