



The DeLorean DMC-12 blazed an 88-mph path to collectibility



DeLorean Motor Company, founded in 1975, was the most famous automotive flop since <u>Tucker</u>. Embroiled in scandal and allegations of fraud, the company came crashing down after its founder, John Z. DeLorean, was arrested in 1982, the target of a drug-trafficking sting operation. When the car factory shut down, angry workers chucked tooling into the ocean. The <u>DeLorean-built</u> vehicle was a rolling punchline when Hollywood chose one as Doc Brown's 88-mph time machine in *Back to the Future*, which hit theaters in 1985. But the 38 years—has it really been that long?—since the movie's debut have been kind to DeLorean's only model, the DMC-12. Very kind, all things considered.

A starring role as the most famous movie-car ever (other than, maybe, <u>James Bond's Aston Martin</u>) certainly helps. The cultural relevance of the *Back to the Future* DeLorean is so massive that it in 2021 was added to the <u>National Historic Vehicle Register</u>. The market for the cars is healthy, the community around them is vibrant and multigenerational, the aftermarket support for them is vast, and "new" DeLoreans are in the works thanks to the <u>founder's daughter</u>. Can you say that about any other low-volume carmaker that went bust 40 years ago?





Corvette Wins Canadian Black Book Residual Value Award for Second Consecutive Year



For the second year in a row, Corvette has won the <u>Canadian</u> <u>Black Book's Residual Value Award</u> in the Sports Car Luxury category, beating out the Audi R8 and Lexus LC500 in the second annual competition this year.

The 2023 awards include 16 vehicle categories and five overall brand categories and forecast residual values in 2027, with Corvette expected to hold the most value then at a predicted 84.2 percent.


The 2023 Best Residual Value Awards measure vehicles' values into the future, recognizing vehicles that are expected to hold the largest percentage of their MSRP 48 months after the original date of purchase.














Corvette Racing at Le Mans: Win No.9

New Barbie Movie Sparks Increase in Internet Searches for Pink Corvettes

The new movie starring Margot Robbie as Barbie and Ryan Gosling as her love interest Ken doesn't make its debut on the big screen until July 21, but already it's breaking the internet ... sort of.

British AutoTrader reports that car listings advertising pink C5 convertible Corvettes – Barbie's sports car! – have garnered more than 12,000 web views in the last month, some 120% more than this time last year for the same amount of stock.

But it's not just pink Corvettes that are drawing attention. AutoTrader says that listings of pink convertibles of all makes and models are up 93% over last year.

On behalf of Corvettes of Durham, Susan Gomes and Anne Halverson presented the cheque to Cindy Bennett of the Humane Society.






NIAGARA CORVETTE CLUB celebrating 50
