## A WARM WELCOME FOR ALL

Our associate preacher *Mark West*, preaches, teaches classes, ministers in the nursing home, coordinates our visitation teams, and work with our Bible camp and youth in general. In addition, we have a radio program on 102.1 FM that airs each weekday around 12:15. If anyone has special needs our Christian Counselor, Dale Sadler, is ready to help by calling 615-513-3642

## **Biblical Prophecy vs Man's Prophecy**

Sometimes man takes it upon himself to make predictions of one sort or another. When someone assures others that the prediction will come true, and this spurs people on to certain actions, then a very grave and serious situation develops.

There are people today who lead their lives, at least in part, according to what they read in a horoscope. But living a life according to the horoscope's advice can be very predictable and unfulfilling since the predictions are readily seen to be too common and generalized. It isn't saying much if I predict that you like to wear black clothes and need to change your wardrobe. You see, I could have gathered from a conversation that something traumatic had happened to

you and gave a suggestion which would likely fit the situation. In comparison to this, Biblical prophecy often deals with monumental events of utmost significance (eg. the birth of a Savior, neither unimportant or common). "But," some may say, "what of the prophecies of men like Nostradamus, now was he an inspired person?"

Well, first, prophecies given by men like Nostradamus are given on an incredible range of possible subjects in a context of completely unrelated statements, this only adds to obscurity. The reader is left with a variety of possible interpretations of the so-called prophecy due to the lack of a framework in which to consider the "prophecy". The Bible is not like that. It presents prophecy in the context of a unified story dealing with man's sin and salvation through Jesus from Genesis to Revelation. Reading the text or consulting a variety of Bible study aides will easily bear this out. Secondly, at least some of the prophecies of men, if they are thought to be understood, may turn up to be wrong. But due to God's nature, every prophecy from Him would come true. Finally, the prophecies themselves are different, as can be seen in reading the Bible and comparing it to these other writings.

What, then, is the nature of Biblical prophecy? The scriptures "lay down the gauntlet" when it comes to prophecy, challenging the would be prophets to present their prophecy for all to see and compare it with what actually occurs (cf. Isa. 41:21-23). In this way the authority of the prophet would be established.

### **Some Bible Prophecies**

The scriptures present to us a complete picture of prophecy when the Bible is considered as a whole. These prophecies center upon the coming Savior and King, Jesus. In looking at just a few books of the Bible, one sees a kaleidoscope of different prophecies dealing in one way or another with the coming Messiah.

In Jeremiah 23:5,6 one sees the coming of a King and "THE LORD..." In Jer. 31:15 one reads of lamentation which fits with not only the Old Testament times but also with a future event in connection with the Messiah (cf. Mt. 2:17,18). The Old Testament thus explains to the people of its time the coming days in a way that they can identify with. Jer. 31:31-34 prepares the way for the New Covenant which would come with the new Priest and King (i.e. Jesus, cf. Heb. 8). Thus from just a fraction of the Old Testament... (continued next week)
