January Reflection

Mark 4:38-39 "Jesus woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind and waves stopped. Jesus said to the disciples, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?'"

When I was young I hated bedtime, not because I wasn't tired, but because of the beasts that lurked in the night. For me, I was never scared of ghosts or faceless monsters, my bedtime enemy was real, it was fierce, known around the world for its size. You see I was deathly afraid of the mighty, bloodthirsty tortoise. My parents had left me with a baby sitter at one point, a youth in the church, who convinced me that a tortoise was not only the meanest of all animals, it was fast, violent and could rip you to shreds in only seconds. And a tortoise's favorite food was little boys. I was terrified of tortoises.

So each night I would have my dad to check my bed, closet, the hall, make sure that the doors were locked, and make sure that there were no tortoises hanging around the parsonage in Statesville, North Carolina. After he looked around he would come to tuck me in. I would try to go to sleep, but at the first sound, the first creak in the wood, I would turn and run into my parents bedroom and my dad would repeat the process. I don't know how long this went on for, probably until I went to the zoo and saw a tortoise for real, but I always knew where to run to whenever I was scared, straight to my dad. Maybe I just needed to hear my dad say the words, "why are you afraid of a tortoise, I will go check it out." But after he checked there was always calm afterwards.

When we meet Jesus and the disciples today, they are crossing the Sea of Galilee, certainly not the most intimidating body of water, but even a small body of water can become tumultuous in a second. So it is on this day in Galilee, a great storm arises, and as the waves start crashing into the boat, these disciples, these men who have made their lives on the sea, who live and breathe because of the sea, start to get scared. So we know that this was an awful bad storm.

While the disciples are trying to bail out water, there is screaming, yelling, and cussing, in the middle of this wild and hectic scene where the disciples are sure that they are going to die. They look over and there in the stern of the boat, sleeping like a baby is Jesus. The disciples almost can't believe that Jesus could be sleeping while they believe that they are dying.

So Peter runs over to Jesus and starts to shake him awake, and upon waking up Jesus has all the disciples in his face yelling, "Teacher do you not care that we are perishing?" Well Jesus wakes up, rebukes the wind, says to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Wouldn't you know it after Jesus says these words, the wind stops, the waves cease and the boats continue on their journey at a comfortable pace.

But the disciples it appears aren't quite sure what to do. I love that Mark leaves us with the questions of the disciples, for they ask one another, "Who is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" The disciples are coming off of this wonderful experience of seeing Jesus in action, feeding all those people with five loaves and two fish, they have seen him teach and preach, they have seen him heal, and all they are looking for is some peace and quite as they go over to the Gentile side of the Sea of Galilee. And instead of peace, they find a storm.

So it is with life, often all we want is peace and quite, we want our routines, but instead of peace and quite we find a storm. We have all been bailing water out of our boats, only to look around and scream for God to appear to quite the storms of our lives, and we feel as if God is asleep at the stern of the boat. It is important to note here, that Jesus does not say, "Don't worry" he does not say, "You have nothing to fear," he asks, "Why are you afraid?"

Because the hard truth is the fearsome things in this life are very real: isolation, pain, illness, rejections, job-loss, money problems, and death. There are things to be afraid of in this life. But as we grow in faith, we come to understand that even though such terrifying things are very real, they do not have the last word. They do no have ultimate power over us, because reigning over this world of fearsome things is a God who is mightier than they.

Time and time again in Scripture the words, "Do not be afraid" are spoken. It is, you might, say the first and last words of the gospel. It is the word the angels speak to the terrified shepherds, and the word spoken at the tomb when the women discover it empty: "Do not be afraid." We are called to let go of our fear instinct, not because there are no scary things on the seas of our days, not because there are no storms, fierce winds, or waves, but rather because God is with us.

Now hear the good news, even though we may at times feel abandoned in the storms of our lives, we are not alone. The greatest thing that faith in God can teach us is even though there are real and terrifying things in this life, they need not paralyze us; they need not have dominion over us; they need not own us, because we are not alone in the boat. God has conquered the world and indeed God is with us. I pray that your new year is off to a great start, and I for one can't wait to see what God is going to do with First UMC in 2025!
