Do you remember when Bob Barker would call out a contestant on 'Price is Right' saying, "Come on Down"? I imagine the same level of excitement from Bartimaeus in the gospel today, as Jesus calls out for him to 'come to me' Mark 10:50 says "He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus." What a prize this would be for anyone, just to meet Jesus like this, but Jesus has so much more to give Bartimaeus. Jesus will open his eyes, restore his eyesight and give him an entirely new life!

A very significant, yet maybe seemingly small detail, is shared in the first line of the gospel. In Mark 10:46 says Jesus and the disciples were leaving Jericho. Jer-Echo! We can all remember hearing the dramatic Old Testament story about what happened there once. Joshua and the people heard God's word, God's call and faithfully answered it with a joyful shout. Their shout brought down the separating walls, and opened the gift of a new life in the city! There are several connections of comparison between the story of Joshua and Jericho then with Jesus and Bartimaeus now. They include the 1) actions of calling & answering, 2) breaking down walls of separation and 3) leaving behind past hindrances of a previous way of life to accept a new, fuller life with God. There was a lot of calling out-shouting in the story of Jericho from Joshua chapter 6 (they circled the city for seven days blowing the rams horns and on the last day after the blowing horns, all the Israelites shouted in unison on God's command). In Mark's gospel we hear that Bartimaeus cried out twice 'Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me'. Jesus turned and told the crowd, "Call him'. Then the crowd called out making sure Bartimaeus heard that it was Jesus who 'called' him (1x 'cry out' & 3x 'call' in just three verses of Mark 10:47-49) All of this calling out led to Jesus healing Bartimaeus' blindness. This healing broke down barriers preventing him from enjoying full inclusion in society. Bartimaeus' handicap, rendered him unable to worship in the temple (ritual impurity-he can't see to avoid touching un-kosher items) and being handicapped rendered him unable to work and provide for himself (physical danger working without eyesight). So, Bartimaeus was marginalized (details of being 'roadside' & 'crowd rebuked him'). He was impoverished (detail of the 'beggar's cloak'). And Bartimaeus was all alone (no one protecting or guiding him). He was walled off from close relationship to others, not having a city or community to call his own. But wait, Jesus will give him one! Jesus breaks down these walls of separation in Bartimaeus' life by healing his blindness and welcoming him into relationship (He joins the commerce and community of the city again!) This new life is symbolized by the actions of Bartimaeus throwing aside/away his beggar's cloak and staying with Jesus. The reading said, Bartimaeus 'followed Him on the way' (Mk 10:52)! I love the response of Bartimaeus to Jesus' gift. Jesus heals him and Bartimaeus immediately begins to show his gratitude by serving others, too. What he couldn't do for others because of his previous disability, he now compensates for by reaching out and helping others ('on the Way with Jesus'). What a wonderful response of a disciple, who knows what God has done for him and so he is eager to share his new community by helping others who suffer handicaps, too.

One last point: I love Bartimaeus' attitude when he enthusiastically asks Jesus, "*I want to see!*" I imagine this might be Mark's abbreviation of Bartimaeus really saying, "Jesus, bless me with sight, I want to see <u>you</u>!" What better first-view is there with our newly opened eyes, than to see the very face of God in Jesus! He being the first thing we see! And how much more personal an encounter Bartimaeus has with Him than that he heard, felt His touch and saw Jesus in this first encounter! It made Bartimaeus a disciple! I am struck by the excited eagerness of him. Like every good student, Bartimaeus is enthusiastic to have new worlds opened to him! That is what it takes: the desire for change along with the openness and interest in having God change us! Jesus'' earlier teaching words echo here, "Ask and it will be given to you; <u>seek and you will find;</u> knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matt 7:7). In educational circles, they say, "When the student is ready, the teacher will show up!" It means that whether the teacher-figure has on a real teacher's cap or gown on or not, that just as soon as any student is primed to learn, then, it will happen. Their knowledge will increase! Their enthusiasm will be matched with education. They will learn-they will see!
