As a reminder, in March 2024 during our Adjourned Session in Forsyth, GA, the report from First VP Rev. Stanley A. Smith and Dea. Lee Kelley introduced information regarding a new construction project to add a Dining Hall with a catering Kitchen to the Main or Multi-purpose building. It was approved by the Executive Board and the Parent Body. Almost immediately, several Pastors gave donations of \$1000.00 to support the project and others made financial pledges to show their support. A Dining Hall will be very beneficial for us during our meeting dates on the property, allowing us to prepare food and eat without disrupting services or other programming that may be taking place in our main building. We will also have the possibility of making our property a revenue-generator for the Convention by way of allowing the use of our Center for Conferences, Family Reunions, Fishing Retreats, Church Picnics or Weddings...maybe even mine!

"To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven: A time to be born, and a time to die;" As we prepare for a change in seasons, let us be reminded that God has given us the field of medicine to assist in living a healthy life.

I continue to be discouraged when we, as a people, do not avail ourselves of the preventive medical care available to us. Adults over the age of 50 should have an annual wellness exam. Our babies and young children need frequent examinations and immunization updates. Teenagers and young adults should have wellness examinations at least every two years.

Proper health screenings should be done by your providers of medical care during the routine physicals. Prevention is key, and finding problems early will lead to early intervention and much better outcomes. There is absolutely no reason for African Americans to continue to have such poor healthcare outcomes. We are leaders in death from all cancers, because we are late in seeking medical care and present with advance stages of the disease. Please do not be afraid to go to the doctor. If you are not comfortable seeking medical care, find a physician or healthcare practitioner (nurse practitioner/physician assistant) with whom you can form a comfortable relationship. Please avail yourselves of the prevention tools available.

Take your flu and COVID vaccines this fall, to prevent serious illness from these potentially deadly viruses which are prevalent in the community during the winter months. Remember: eat a healthy diet, exercise, meditate, and ask for proper discernment from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT YOUR (?HURCH?

Mt. Zion Second Baptist Church will host a community Voter Registration Drive every Sunday in September, beginning Sunday, September 1st from 1:30-3:00 p.m. (following morning service) in the *Fellowship Hall. The deadline to register for the General Election is October 7, 2024 in order to vote in the November 5th election. You can register here even if you live in another county.

To register to vote you must:

- Be a citizen of the United States
- Be a legal resident of the county
- Be at least 17 1/2 years of age to register and 18 years of age to vote
- Not be serving a sentence for conviction of a felony involving moral turpitude
- Have not been found mentally incompetent by a judge
