- 3) Giving in excess of our current budget can be set aside for our new Youth Pastor.

Waiting can be frustrating, but in this case, we're waiting on the Lord to find us the perfect candidate. All of this is in God's Hands, and there are simply no better hands for such a task. We are looking for the right person at the right time in his/her life: I think we'd better let God handle this!

So Many Ways to Serve God at First

We feel God has answered prayers for another pastor for our congregation! Now, we need to be praying for good and giving hearts to make up the difference in the budget. If you haven't heard Pr. Bob's sermon on the 10 dimes, here's a recap. You have 10 dimes. One you put in savings, one goes to God....actually, Biblically, the first dime goes to God, then you have 8 dimes for yourself. So, for an additional \$5 dollars on the \$50 you give per month (and I know that number may be more or less), we could afford to hire an ordained, young pastor to add an additional 30% to our church's life and well-being....not to mention Pr. Bob's! Again, no matter what your giving to the church, just 10 % more would cover the need. So, please prayerfully consider ways to add that 10%.

If you can't swing the dollars, maybe helping with a Sunday School class in the fall, VBS in the summer, serve on a committee, help with the Community Dinner, in the nursery, in the

church choir. So many ways to serve God and First. Consider being a part of our Prayer Ministry; take an additional few minutes to join a Bible study or prayer study. There will be chances all summer and this coming fall.

Create that intimacy with God....He wants to hear from you and speak to you. It just takes a little quiet time...begin with the Jesus Prayer, "Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me!" (Mark 10:44-48). Pray without ceasing! (1Thessalonians 5:17) Currently, the Prayer Study Group (phase 1) has picked up some others to study Nehemiah, a poison taster/cupbearer, engineer, but most of all a simple man of PRAYER. 


