CHRIST SUFFERED FOR YOU AND ME

(Mark 11:1-10; Isa. 50:4-7; Ps. 22:8-9, 17-20, 23-24; Phil. 2:6-11; Mark 14: 1-15:47)

Today marks the last Sunday in Lent! It is Palm Sunday, otherwise called Passion Sunday because the theme of Christ's suffering, crucifixion and death begins with the reading of the passion. On Palm Sunday, we commemorate the last act in the drama of the life of Jesus - His triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Jesus' entry into Jerusalem is the fulfillment of the Divine Will that He must go there to suffer, die and be raised on the third day (Matthew 16:21). Today's celebration marks the beginning of the most sacred time of the Church – The Holy Week, when every Christian is invited to reflect on the sacrificial love of God for His sinful people.

In the Old Testament times, it was the custom of the great prophets to express their message in dramatic actions when they felt words were not enough - Prophet Ahijah of Shiloh tore his new garment into twelve pieces as a revolt against Solomon and thus predicted the end of Solomon's kingship (1 Kings 11:29-32) - Prophet Jeremiah prophesied by putting ropes and a yoke around his neck and thus predicted the capture and the enslavement of the Israelites by Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon (Jeremiah 27:1-6). Like King David and all kings in his culture, Jesus enters Jerusalem riding on the traditional animal, the colt (ass) "on which no one has ever sat." Jesus could not have chosen a more dramatic moment for His entry to Jerusalem than the time of Passover when about 2.5 million pilgrims from all corners of the world were expected to congregate in Jerusalem, the Eternal City, to celebrate the Passover Feast.

Jesus' decision to go to Jerusalem was not a sudden one, taken at the spur of the moment. It was calculated and well planned - it was a deliberate Messianic claim - Jesus is God's Anointed One - He is the Messiah. Thus, on Palm Sunday, Christians all over the world gather to celebrate and proclaim Christ as the Messiah and Savior of the world. On this day, you and I solemnly process with blessed palms in honor of the God Who has come into the world so that He might deliver His people from bondage. Our participation in the liturgy of Holy Week should be a stark reminder to us that suffering, pain, and ultimately death are also a mysterious part of our passage to a glorious life with our Lord, Who has come so that you and I may have life and have it more abundantly.

When you and I began the Lenten journey five weeks ago on Ash Wednesday, Prophet Joel exhorted us to "Rend your hearts, not your garment..." The symbolism of waving the palms should go beyond the physical, and thrust us to the spiritual, where we must "rend our hearts, not our palms." This is the day when Christians must submit themselves to "walk the walk and talk the talk" with Christ. The Passion accounts that we hear today and on Good Friday, which culminate in the proclamation of the resurrection of our Lord, are an invitation for us to engage and to contemplate the unqualified love of God for us.

As we struggle to embark on a journey with Christ to Calvary, He shows us that "though He was in the form of God, (He) did not claim equality with God...Rather, He emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness...He humbled Himself," to the point of washing the feet of His disciples on Holy Thursday; and dying for you and me on Good Friday. Christ suffered and died for us so that we might follow in His example, and thus, empty ourselves and allow Him to take control of our lives. Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem today gives us hope that He has overcome all the obstacles that might be in our way to prevent us from gaining entry into eternal life. He enters Jerusalem, "meek and riding on an ass" (Zechariah 9:9) - showing us that He came not to destroy but to love; not to condemn but to help; not in the might of arms like the kings of old, but in the strength of love. 




ADULT FAITH FORMATION - RCIA
