My name is . I am the parent of a Sophomore.

I am submitting into the public record facts relative to wireless radiation and the health of the students and teachers. Wireless is being banned from schools.

In April 2016 Haifa, Israel, announced that it was banning Wi-Fi from all of its schools until it can be proven safe. A quote from attorney Dafna Tachover reads: "Electro-Sensitivity is an epidemic. The public must be told. Wi-Fi in schools is a disaster and as a person who spends two to four hours every day on the phone with people and children who got sick, with many contemplating suicide, I urge you all to be uncompromising. The truth, and all of it must be told. Thanks to anyone out there who stands up to evil and stupidity."

Argentina is set to take up a bill that limits electromagnetic pollution exposure, and calls for, among other things, connections in schools and hospitals to be hard wired.

In mid 2015, the Italian State Parliament of South Tyrol voted to "... replace existing wireless networks whenever possible with networks that emit less radiation at schools, preschools, hospitals, nursing homes, and other public facilities."

Announced in 2014, Ghent Municipality in Belgium banned wireless Internet from spaces that cater to children between 0 – three years of age.

Argentina

From El Nuevo Cronista comes the news that Argentina is set to take up a bill that limits electromagnetic pollution exposure, and calls for connections in schools and hospitals to be hard-wired.

Among its most important aspects, the bill provides that the irradiating devices should be installed at a minimum distance of 100 meters from inhabited areas. Limits the maximum radiation levels $10 \mu\text{W} / \text{cm}^2$ (1000 microwatts) for analog modulation, and $0.1 \mu\text{W} / \text{cm}^2$ for digital modulation signals.
